This day opens with a strong breeze from the E.S. &
steering by it on the Southern tack at sunset took
in light sails. at being squally. Watch employed in
ships duty caught 2 porpoises

Lat. 23-20 S. Long. 69-49 W. So ends this day
Sunday Nov. 28th

This day opens with a good breeze from E.S. &
steering S.W. at daylight made all sail. Nothing
in sight

Lat. 25-35 S. Long. 69-24 W. So ends this day
Monday Nov. 29th

This day opens with a good breeze from the Eastward
steering S.W. at day. Took in the main. Boat on
deck & repaired & painted her. Nothing in sight
better part wind light & squally. Watch

Lat. 27-40 S. Long. 69-29 W. So ends this day

Tuesday Dec. 30th

This day opens with light baffling winds. Took
in main. Breeze & good top sail at daylight made
all sail. Steering S.W. wind about N.W. & watch
employed in ships duty. Nothing in sight

Lat. 28-56 S. Long. 69-41 W. So ends this day
Wednesday Dec. 31st

This day opens with a light breeze from the E. Steering
S by W. Watch employed in ships duty. Nothing in
sight Lat. 30-03 S. So ends this day

Thursday Dec. 1st

This day opens with light baffling winds & rain squalls
steering S by W. put in the main. Boat on the canvas and
painted her inside. Nothing of note in sight

Lat. 31-12 S. Long. 69-25 W. So ends this day
Friday Dec. 2nd

This day opens with a calm about 10. adack had a light
breeze from the E. Steering S.W. by S. watch employed
in ships duty. Sails in sight going to the Eastward

Lat. 31-57 S. Long. 69-25 W. So ends this day

Booke out one coil of cordage. Took boats falls of off
it for S. & waste boat. arrol & wheel rope
