

Remarks on Board Bark Bertha of New Bedford
on Blauken ship off Cape Cod Jan 21st

This day opens with a strong breeze from the S.W. steering
by it on the Starboard tack about 9 o'clock on the Starboard side
one large whale about one mile from the ship lowered three
heads soon after saw a more whale about 9 o'clock the second
made with an eye of them the third was dashed with horns
at his head then the whales started to the windward did not
see them but some more came along side about 11 o'clock
soon after one of the crew perceived a whale going
in & lowered down 3 boats the second made speed on board
the third went on and struck then the fourth struck him

~~all~~ all three boats helped kill him and took
him along side about 4 o'clock then put up
cutting gear & hooked on his four sides until dark then made
fast for the night took 400 lbs. of blubber & 100 lbs. of
oil the Blauken ship off Cape Cod Jan 22nd

This day opens with a strong breeze from the South at daylight
collected all hands & went to the whale in finished cutting
about dark made the head fast along side and dashed the whales
Lat 22-54 this Blauken ship off Cape Cod Jan 22nd

Monday Jan 23rd

This day opens with a good fresh breeze from the S.W.
going on with a head along side water employed in baling
out oil and clearing up the deck about 10 o'clock hooked
with his gunk took it on and took it in about 3 o'clock
hooked on the case & baled it out as of it about
sun set saw down the cutting tackle and were away
on the Blauken ship off Cape Cod Jan 23rd

Monday Jan 24th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S.W. steering
by it on the Starboard tack under short sail water employed
in baling out oil and cutting up a whale nothing in sight
Lat 22-57 S

Tuesday Jan 25th

This day opens with light variable winds water employed
in baling out oil & clearing up the deck finished baling
about 8 o'clock S.M. Under a latter part calmed down in sight
on the Blauken ship off Cape Cod with the cut on his back

Wednesday Jan 26th

This day opens with a calm water employed in clearing
up the deck & getting the ready nothing in sight but a
latter part had a light breeze from the S.W. steering by it
on the Starboard tack No Obs. Lat 22-58 S

Thursday Jan 27th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S.W. steering
by it on the Starboard tack at daylight water went to the
down oil in the fore hold finished about sunset. 100 lbs
nothing in sight the Blauken ship off Cape Cod
Lat 22-22 S

Friday Jan 28th

This day opens with light variable winds at 9 o'clock took
the reefs out of the topsails and dunnies all the light sails water
employed in ships deck nothing in sight Under a latter
part light breeze from S.W. heading S.W. &
Lat 22-25 S Long 69-47 W
