

Remarks On Board Bark Butler of New Bedford

Friday March 11th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S. Steering by St. for the Western Tack at daylight made all sail. Watch employed in Ships Duty. Nothing of Note in sight. Latter part wind about the same Steering W.

Latⁿ 12-00 S. Long^e 05-20 E. So ends this day

Saturday March 12th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S. Steering by St. Watch employed in Washing clothes. Nothing of Note in sight. At sunset took in light sails. Nothing in sight of Note.

Latⁿ 10-50 S. Long^e 04-10 E. So ends this day

Sunday March 13th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S. Steering by St. W. at daylight made all sail. Nothing in sight of Note. At sunset shortened sail. Steering by St. W.

Latⁿ 15-50 S. Long^e 03-17 E. So ends this day

Monday March 14th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S. Steering by St. W. at daylight made all sail. Took the Steam Boat of the house and secured Mate Capt. & Crews repairing it. In forenoon in sight caught one Sumner's Short-tail Sail and came to the Wind on the St. Tack heading W. S. W.

Latⁿ 15-15 S. Long^e 02-20 E. So ends this day
one Man of Duty Sick. Bore.

Wednesday March 15th

Thursday March 16th

This day opens with a fresh breeze from the S. Steering by St. in the Western Tack at daylight made sail & kept W. S. W. at 10 AM kept N. E. S. At 1 PM came to the Wind on the St. Tack heading E. Saw one fin-back. finished the Boat and painted her. In the latter part wind the same.

Latⁿ 14-28 S. Long^e 02-10 E. So ends this day

Friday March 17th

This day opens with a fresh breeze from the S. Steering by St. in the Eastern Tack heading E. by North. Watch employed in Ships Duty at 4 PM took in the boat that was on the Water cranes put it on the house & put out the other one. Nothing in sight one Man of Duty Sick. Bore. Latⁿ 13-10 S. Long^e 03-36 E. So ends

Saturday March 18th

This day opens with a fresh breeze from the S. Steering by St. in the St. Tack heading E. and latter part E. S. E. Wind. S. broke out the mainsail & main top-sail & long sail and kept them. Nothing of Note in sight. Bore of Duty.

Latⁿ 12-37 S. Long^e 05-03 E. So ends this day

Sunday March 19th

This day opens with a fine breeze from St. W. Steering by St. in the St. Tack heading E. by S. Most of the time saw plenty of Porpoises & Sperm. Watch employed in Ships Duty. Short-tail Short-tail Sail.

Latⁿ 12-20 S. Long^e 06-25 E.

So ends this day
