by it on the Eastern tack with all sail except fore top gallant sail
At 10 o'clock P.M. made all sail except fore top gallant sail
At 6 o'clock P.M. lowered White Boat went on board
The Bark Musing Star to buy some Beer. Capt. Ballus
came back with the Boat took her up about sunset
and stood along by the wind took in light sails
Lat. 42-12 S. Long. 71-39 E. So ends this day

Thursday April 21st

This day opens with a fine breeze from the S by E
Steering by it on the Eastern tack at daylight made
all sail except fore top gallant sail Watch employed in
Ships duty. Saw porpoises & killers
Lat. 42-24 S. Long. 72-00 E. So ends this day

Friday April 22nd

This day opens with a fine breeze from the South
Steering by it on the Eastern tack with the same sail
and Watch employed in Ships Duty. Saw porpoises
about 6 o'clock P.M. lowered the White Boat & took
Capt. Ballus on board his ship.
Lat. 42-15 S. Long. 72-40 E. So ends this day

Robinson Master Arriving

Saturday April 23rd

This day opens with a light breeze from S by W
Steering by it on the Eastern tack Watch employed
in washing clothes & saw finbacks. Black fish & porpoises
at sunset took in light sails & mainsail
Lat. 42-02 S. So ends this day

Sunday April 24th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S.E.
Steering by it on the Eastern tack at daylight made all
sail at 1 o'clock P.M. went around heading W.S.W.
Nothing of note in sight Lat. 42-56 S. So ends
Monday April 25th

This day opens with a light breeze from S.E. & Steaming
by it on the Western tack with all sail set. Watch employed
in Ships Duty. Nothing of note in sight at sunset
took in fore top gallant sail
Lat. 42-30 S. Long. 75-51 E. So ends this day

Tuesday April 26th

This day opens with a fresh breeze from the S.E. &
Steering by it on the Western tack Watch employed in
Ships Duty. Saw porpoises & finbacks at sunset
Shortened sail heading W.S.W. Ship leaking
about 400 strokes in 24 hours
Lat. 42-15 S. Long. 74-38 E.
