Thursday April 28th

This day opens with a strong breeze from the South steering by it on the Eastern Tack at daylight passed the light Sails Watch employed in Ships Duty The same Bark in sight Sunset Shortened Sail

Lat. 09-40 S Long. 07-27 E So ends this day

Friday April 29th

This day opens with a fresh breeze from the South steering by it on the Eastern Tack at daylight made sail Watch employed in Ships Duty about 3 o'clock P.M. Command with the Broke Bagell. Swallow Master 12 Mauds out 250 lbs gave up gaming about dark Tack in light Sails caught one porpoise the Cook off Duty Sick

Saturday April 30th

This day opens with a fresh breeze from the South steering by it on the Eastern Tack at daylight made sail at 4 o'clock P.M. went around Watch employed in various jobs put on a new hemp Wheel rope Saw the same Bark & plenty of porpoises caught 3 of them at 6 o'clock P.M. went around So ends this day

Sunday May 1st

This day opens with a light breeze from the S & E steering by it on the Eastern Tack at daylight made sail one Bark & porpoises in sight at Sunset Tack in light sails at 10 P.M. went around Cook off Duty Sick Master in the Bully Lat. 10-15 S Long. 09-38 E So ends this day

Monday May 2nd

This day opens with light baffling wind about 1 o'clock P.M. had a good breeze from S.W. by W. Breeze around the point on the Sth Tack and kept by the Wind with all sail out heading S by E one Sail & porpoises in sight Sunset Tack in light Sails Cook the same Lat. 10-32 S Long. 10-12 E So ends this day

Tuesday May 3rd

This day opens with a light breeze from the S & W steering by it on the Sth Tack at daylight made sail about 5 o'clock P.M. had it calm lowered down the Wake Boat and cleared the Banicles & grass off the Ship & washed her outside one Sail & porpoises in sight latter part light breeze from the Windward Cook off Duty Lat. 10-50 S So ends this day
