This day opens with a light breeze from the S. Steering
by it on the Eastern Tack at Sunrise made sail at 10 o'clock
When went around and steered N. W. at Sunset Shortened
Sail Watch employed in Ship's Duty out of 12 fathoms of
Bow-line & made three Warps Saw Killers & porpoises
Sunset came to the wind on the Western Tack
Lat. 12-38 S Long. 17-36 S So ends this day

Thursday May 12th

This day opens with a fresh breeze from the S.
Sailing back on the Western Tack at daylight made
sail & kept by the wind on the same tack until 7 o'clock
When kept to the Northward Watch employed in
Ship's Duty porpoises in sight at Sunset came to
the wind on the Eastern Tack with main-cast aback
Lat. 12-05 S Long. 00-20 S So ends this day

Friday May 13th

This day opens with a fresh breeze from the S.
Sailing back at daylight kept N. by E at 11 o'clock
Steered N. by E. After Saw a Sail came down
& spoke us it was the bark Stafford King Master
20 months and 500 lbs Spinnail Sails & they came
on board went back about 8 o'clock & in nothing
more in sight

This day opens with a fresh breeze from the S. S. W.
Steering by it on the Eastern Tack about 6 o'clock commenced
To make the land the light sails and kept to by S at
Sunset came to the wind and Tack in light sails the
Stafford in light sail employed in Ship's Duty

Lat. 10-45 S Long. 10-00 S So ends this day

Sunday May 15th

This day opens with a fresh breeze from the S. S. W.
Steering by it on the Eastern Tack Saw White water
and Killers hauled with the Stafford until 9 o'clock
On Sunset Shortened Sail

Lat. 10-42 S Long. 09-05 S So ends this day

Monday May 16th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S. S. W.
Steering by it on the Eastern Tack at Sunrise made
Sail about 8 o'clock a new bar a sail came down and
hauled with her it was the bark Salazar David
Master 23 months and 250 lbs Spinnail Shortened Sail
and hauled about main-peak on the Western Tack
Saw Black fish & porpoises caught one

Lat. 10-40 S Long. 10-10 S So ends this day
