

Remarks on Board Bark. Birth of John Goodford

Thursday May 31st

This day spent with lying at anchor and daylight called all hands and found there all on Board. Windy came about 12 o'clock and Capt. sent him forward for disobedience. Two boats went after Wood came back about 4 o'clock. P.M. with about half a boat load. So ends this day.

Wednesday June 1st

This day spent with lying at anchor waiting for Wood about 6 o'clock P.M. let all of the crew go to shore except 4 men came on Board at Sunset.

Thursday June 2nd

This day spent with lying at anchor all hands on Board. At 8 o'clock a more wind in shore came on Board. At Sunset after dinner went after wood came back about 7 o'clock P.M. with a small boat load. So ends.

Friday June 3rd

This day spent with lying at anchor about 2 o'clock P.M. sent the Boat after wood came back about 4 P.M. with one Boat load. Capt. & Wife went on shore about 2 P.M. came back about 4 P.M. then Mr. Master the Third Mate went to him & wanted him to leave him ashore for he told him that he would not do any more work on Board of this vessel he says the reason is that the Capt. left the vessel in charge of the Carpenter but he did not. Third Mate used indecent language and the Capt. told him to take his things out of the Cabin and put them in the Storeage or he could not sit to the Captain's table as he had refused to work he told the Capt. that he would not.

Robinson Master saying at Calender

go in the Storeage but would go on shore with his baggage. Capt. told him that if he did he done it against his orders and could not take them in the Ship's Boat. he told the Capt. that he would get them on shore if he had to swim with them. Sent his things down in the Storeage and had a Spare Bottle for him. at 2 P.M. decided the Matches.

Saturday June 4th

This day spent with lying at anchor all hands on Board. At 2 o'clock P.M. sent the Boat after wood came back about 2 P.M. with part of a boat could not get any more at 3 got the Ship underweigh and found that the Third Mate was gone some of the crew saw him go in a canoe. At 4 o'clock again and waited until 5 P.M. then the Boat up the river and stored in N.W. with all sail out. Wind light from the South. So ends this day.

Sunday 5th

This day spent with a light breeze from the South. Steered North by S. all hands on Board except Third Mate. Mailed the Third Mate and of one of the Boatsteers Joseph Dins and Charles Parker for Boatsteers and put Walter Hensley in the Storeage at 5 o'clock P.M. let go anchor in 4 fathoms and 24 fathoms off. Sailed about one mile from Bark Hires. Ends Master.

So ends this day.
