

Remarks for Broad Bark Breeze of New Bedford
Tuesday July 19th

This day opens with lying at anchor in a path of water
200 yds. Cable Watch employed in cutting up blubber
at daylight sent 2 boats cruising north & second
boat boats came along side about sunset saw a
few Whales but no wind to get in them took of Duff,
Dick and 2 men foreward. So ends this day

Wednesday July 20th

This day opens with lying at anchor at daylight however
two boats the first & second boat saw a few Whales
but they were wild and had it calm most of the day
boats came along side about sunset. So ends this day

Thursday July 21st

This day opens with lying at anchor at daylight first
and second boat went cruising & commenced to
haul out the oil boats came along
side about 5 o'clock saw 3 Whales had it calm most
of the time and they were wild. So ends this day

Friday July 22nd

This day opens with the Watch hauling out oil
at 5 o'clock we called all hands and lowered the
same 2 boats they did not see any Whales saw
some from the ship and the Capt. lowered twice
but did not get in them finished hauling at 1 o'clock
5th boat about dark boats came along side took out the
same 2 men off Duff, Dick. So ends this day

Remarks for Broad Bark Breeze of New Bedford
Saturday July 23rd

This day opens with lying at anchor at daylight the
same 2 boats went cruising north of the crew employed
in ships Duff about 12 o'clock took mass led to
anchors about half a mile off about sunset boats
came along side saw 5 Whales but going quick the
boat and one man off Duff. So ends this day

Sunday July 24th

This day opens with lying at anchor called all hands
at 6 o'clock did not lower any boats the boat off Duff

Monday July 25th

This day opens with lying at anchor called all hands
at daylight and went to work breaking out with
steering down side about 9 o'clock D. took the
anchors and steered to N.W. toward the Fairweather
Island about one o'clock. Mr. M. died. hauled
off shore by the wind and carried him about
4 P.M. his name was W. Jones which is latter
part light breeze from the S.E. steering to W.

So ends this day

Tuesday July 26th

This day opens with a light breeze from the S.E.
steering to W. Watch employed in ships Duff
saw 2 Whales Capt. went after them but
did not get near them

Lat. 42-20 N.

So ends this day
