Monday Sept. 5th

This day opens with lying at anchor all hands employed
in stowing off the pole and getting ready for sea. Sent down
the fore sail and bent the other side sent down the
main top gallant sail & spanker and bent new
ones. So ends this day.

Tuesday Sept. 6th

This day opens with lying at anchor at 6 o'clock A.M.
Sent to boat & crew on shore after the Capt.
The rest of the crew employed in washing ship
inside finished about 12 o'clock then bent the
mainmast and went and brought off the Staver
Boat put her in the house Capt. & Wife came
on board at 10 o'clock A.M. So ends this day.

Wednesday Sept. 7th

This day opens with lying at anchor with a
fresh breeze from the S.S.W. at 7 o'clock hoisted
the sails and hove up the anchor and kept
by the wind steered the anchor and heaved up
the deck all hands employed in working the vessel
to the windward at 8 P.M. The weather land of the
Island bearing S.W. Distance 6 miles about
the same time went around on the Western tack
heading West one hour on board from the Island
Lat. 01-00 North So ends this day.
