

Remarks on Board Ship Wm. West of

176 Tuesday April 8th 1851

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & moderate breeze from the Northward ship steering N.W. under all sail Middle part strong breeze latter part moderate breeze at 10 P.M. sent up a new main top sail & bent it down Nothing of note Lat 19.31 N Longitude 147.58 W

177 Wednesday April 9th

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & moderate breeze from the N.W. ship steering N.W. under all sail Middle part pleasant latter part the same steering N.W. under all sail Employed in ship's duty

Latitude 20.50 North
Longitude 150.51 West

178 Thursday April 10th

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & moderate breeze from the N.W. ship steering N.W. under all sail Middle part wind from the same latter part thick wind from the N.W. ship steering West under all sail plus Nothing of note Employed in scraping the deck

Latitude 21.10 N Longitude 153.38 W

179 Friday April 11th

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & moderate breeze from the N.W. ship steering West under all sail Middle part pleasant ship steering N.W. under all sail latter part at 10 P.M. saw the Eastermost point of the island of Oahu bearing about West Dist 16 leagues

180 Saturday April 12th

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & strong N.W. trades ship steering along with the land at 8 A.M. entered Moowee passage at 9 A.M. calm at 10 A.M. lowered 4 boats & commenced towing the ship for Moowee harbour at 3 P.M. came to anchor in 25 fathoms of water. 7 ships & several small vessels at anchor. at day light squared the yards
Lying at anchor in Moowee Harbour

181 April 13th 1850

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & moderate breeze from the N.W. at anchor in Moowee harbour. Spiced ship Robinson, Capt. Baker 23 Month out 100 Bbls of oil latter part one watch on liberty

182 Monday April 14th

Lying at anchor in Moowee in at 7 P.M. sent a raft ashore for water at 8 P.M. heaved 100 barrels from shore one employed in hoisting out fore & main hatchway

Tuesday April 15th

First part of this day sent pleasant Employ in ship's duty at 2 A.M. heaved 500 feet of board to ship's deck at 9 P.M. took off a raft of water about 110 Bbls Employed in stowing down water in the store hold arrived this day Barge No. 12 Capt. M. Wade of Warren 21 Month out 100 Bbls of oil sailed ship Monongahella & Rawson & Pacific of N. Bedford
Lying at Moowee

184 Wednesday April 16th

First part of this day at 2 A.M. sent a raft of cash on shore for water Employed in stowing water at 9 P.M. took off a raft of water about 120 Bbls Employed in stowing water in store & main hatchway
Lying at Moowee

185 Thursday April 17th

First part of this day pleasant Employ in stowing water latter part one watch on liberty

186 Friday April 18th

First part of this day sent a raft of cash on shore for water one watch on liberty latter part pleasant (dawn)

Lying at Moowee

187 Saturday April 19th

First part of this day pleasant at dawn set watch returned from liberty 2 black men deserted named Minlow Russell & Walter Thomas at 11 A.M. Mr. Gibson wished to speak to the Capt. the Captain went below and Mr. Gibson used very improper & saucy language to him the Capt. then sent him on deck & will discharge him
