

Remarks on Board Ship W^m Wist of Fairhaven

188 Sunday April 19th

Continued latter part pleasant at 4 P.M. got off a raft of water at 5 P.M. one watch on Liberty at 10 P.M. Discharged & sent Mr Barnard and his thing on shore. 2^d Officer Lickwise Mr Gibbon 4th Officer for improper conduct. Lickwise a seaman named Wilson sick. Employed in stowing water Lying at Mowee

189 Sunday April 20th

First part of this day strong breezes. at 3 A.M. ship dragged her anchor. at 5 A.M. dropped the starboard anchor. at dawn set Capt returned on board ship dragged about 1 1/2 mile Middle part strong breezes. latter part more moderate at 10 P.M. took up the starboard anchor at 11 1/2 P.M. took the anchor and went up to the anchorage place one man Liberia named Bailey & 4 seamen put in the port for abuse to police Lying at Mowee

189 Monday April 21st

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & moderate breezes Capt & 3^d Officer crew on shore Employed in getting off recruits latter part at 8 P.M. Capt & 3^d Officer & 3^d Officer on shore Lying at Mowee

190 Tuesday April 22nd

First part of this day fine pleasant Employed in ship duty & getting ready for sea latter part at 9 P.M. received 31 Bbl of potatoes at 10 P.M. received Mr. Brown at 2^d Officer and Mr. White at 4th Officer Lickwise 6 natives at 11th Officer from shore Lying at Mowee April 22nd 1851

191 Wednesday April 23rd

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & moderate breezes Employed in getting ready for sea at latter part at 9 P.M. took the anchor and went to sea in company with New Bedford ship under all sail Lat between Kane & Molai

192 Thursday April 24th 1851

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & moderate breezes Employed stowing anchor & chain away and now we will commence a new season may it be a prosperous one to us. Middle part pleasant at 11 A.M. luffed by the wind heading N.N.W. under all sail saw the Island bearing West Dist 5 leagues latter part very light breezes from the N.E. ship heading N.N.W. ship Newstead of N.B. in sight a turn Latitude 21-25 North

193 Friday April 25th

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & light breezes from the N.E. ship steering by the wind heading N.N.W. under all sail the North star most point of sight of ovoid. bearing N.W. Dist 2 leagues. Middle part light breezes latter part much the same ship Newstead of N. Bedford in sight the Island of Wake Island in sight Latitude 22-21 N Longitude

194 Saturday April 26th

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & very light breezes from the N.E. the Cape point of Howl bearing N.N.W. Dist 5 leagues ship steering by the wind heading N.W. by W. under all sail saw St. Humphrey Middle part pleasant with very light breezes latter part much the same at 8 P.M. reared ship to the Northward. under all sail ship Newstead of N. Bedford in sight Lat 21 or N Long 152-09 West

195 Sunday April 27th

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & moderate breezes from the N.W. ship steering by the wind heading N.N.E. at 5 A.M. tacked to the Northward. ship Newstead in sight Middle part very light breeze latter part calm saw nothing of note Latitude 22-5 N

196 Monday April 28th

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & calm Middle part the same latter part light breezes from the S.E. ship steering N.W. under all sail Latitude Longitude
