224. Monday May 26th 1851

First part of the day thick overcast weather & moderate breeze from the South Ship steering N by E under all sail Middle part & latter part the same. Employed in ship duty
No Observation this day

225 Tuesday May 27th

First part of this day light breeze & thick weather at 1 P.M. saw a right whale at 1 1/2 P.M. saw a boat at 2 P.M. struck him to the larboard. Boat ~~was~~ at 3 P.M. took him to the ship Middle part pleasant at 4 P.M. commenced cutting at 5 P.M. finished cutting & co
No Observation

226 Wednesday May 28th

First part of this day thick overcast weather & moderate breeze from the S.W. Ship steering N.N.W. under all sail at 3 P.M. very foggy at 4 P.M. saw a large right whale from ship saw a boat but did not get him Middle part foggy. Latter part pleasant at 5 P.M. saw a right whale saw a boat but caught none Employed boiling

227 Thursday May 29th

First part of this day pleasant with moderate breeze from S.W. Ship steering N.N.W. under all sail at 1 P.M. took ship *Clibernia* of New Bedford Capt Baker 20 months out 400 S. Oil Middle part thick overcast weather at 12 M finished boiling about 65 bbl. Latter part thick fog Employed in breaking out the main hatchway to stow down oil. Ship *Clibernia* in sight

228 Friday May 30th

First part of this day thick overcast weather & moderate breeze from the S.W. Ship steering by the wind heading N.N.W. under all sail Middle part the same Latter part very foggy wind the same saw Nothing of Note. Ship *Clibernia* in sight

229 Saturday May 31st 1851

First part of this day thick overcast weather & moderate breeze from the S.W. Ship steering by the wind heading N.N.W. at 1 P.M. saw the *Clibernia* bearing from S.W. to N.E. Dist 10 leagues at 2 P.M. tacked to the Eastward. Middle part thick with snow Latter part at 3 P.M. tacked to the Northward. thick overcast weather & moderate breeze
No Observation this day

230 Sunday (May) June 1st 1851

First part of this day thick overcast weather & very light breeze at 2 P.M. passed a Ice Berque Ship *Clibernia* in sight. Land in sight Dist 5 leagues. at 3 P.M. tacked to the Northward. Latter part thick with light rain at 4 P.M. tacked to the Northward under all sail wind from the S.W. Employed in ship duty saw the back
No Observation this day

231 Monday June 2nd

First part of this day thick overcast foggy weather. Ship steering by the wind heading S.W. Middle part much the same Latter part light breeze with very thick fog at 8 P.M. tacked to the Northward. saw Nothing of Note
No Observation this day

232 Tuesday June 3rd

First part of this day thick fog wind from the S.W. Ship steering by the wind heading S.W. under all sail. Latter part the same saw a ship heading N by W under all sail with thick fog. saw No sporting fish this day. Hope to soon

233 Wednesday June 4th

First part of this day pleasant with very light breeze from the S.W. at 2 P.M. tacked to the Eastward. under all sail the land in sight ship *Clibernia* of N. Bedford in sight. Latter part pleasant wind from the S.W. Ship steering N.E. under all sail. Ship in sight Capt St. Thaddeus in sight bearing N Dist 4 leagues at 10 P.M. Ship in sight
