273 Monday July 14<sup>th</sup> 1851

First part of this day thick overcast weather & strong breeze from the Southward Ship steering by the wind N.W. under all sail Latter part pleasant Ship steering N.W. by E. under Top sail & courses & jib saw 2 Ship steering to the Southward

274 Tuesday July 15<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & moderate breeze from the Westward Ship steering N.W. by E. under Top sail Courses & jib at 5 A.M. spoke Ship Robert Edwards of New Bedford Capt Burgess 500 & 100 Whale oil at 10 A.M. spoke Ship America Smith of N Bedford & bark Harvest of N Bedford. the Barque Harvest had the crew of Ship America of N Bedford on board the America having run into a cask of Ice & sunk at 5 A.M. July 14<sup>th</sup> 1851 at 11 A.M. Capt returned on board with 5 of Ship America crew. Latter part calm. 8 Ship in sight

275 Wednesday July 16<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day pleasant & 3 Boats Employed in whaling. Middle part Boats came on board saw 2 whales going north to N.E. & another of them Latter part thick fog saw nothing of note

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & moderate breeze. Employed in ships duty at 5 A.M. spoke Ship to N.W. Latter part strong gale from the Northward. Ship lying to under Close reefed main Top sail & fore top mast stay sail. Ship in sight

277 Friday July 18<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day thick overcast weather & moderate & strong gale from the Southward Ship lying to under Close reefed main Top sail & fore top mast stay sail. Main Spruces. Latter part more moderate. Set all sail Ship steering to Northward under all sail saw thick fog. No Observation

278 Saturday July 19<sup>th</sup> 1851

First part of this day thick overcast weather & very light breeze from the Eastward Ship steering by the wind heading South under all sail Latter part thick overcast weather & moderate breeze from the N.E. Ship steering South under all sail Saw several Ships at 7 P.M. spoke Ship Alomongola of New Bedford 11 month out oil unknown

279 Sunday July 20<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & moderate breeze from the N.E. Ship steering South under all sail. Employed in ships duty Latter part calm Archangel bay bearing South Dist 5 leagues one ship in sight

Latitude 52° 10' North

280 Monday July 21<sup>st</sup>

First part of this day fine pleasant weather & moderate breeze. Ship steering by the wind heading S.E. & under all sail. Employed in ships duty. Saw nothing of note. Hope to soon Latter part thick overcast weather & strong breeze Ship steering by the wind heading to the S.E. under Top sail. courses & jib

First part of this day fine thick overcast weather & strong breeze from the Southward. Ship steering by the wind under Top sail & bare sail. heading S.N.E. Latter part more moderate. Set all sail Ship steering. N.W. passed a Barque & a Ship

First part of this day thick overcast weather & moderate breeze Ship steering by the wind under all sail. at 5 P.M. spoke Ship Harvest of N.B. Capt. Almy 10 month out. 500 Whale oil. Latter part pleasant. Ship steering by the wind heading S.E. under all sail. 3 Ship in sight. 1 whale in sight

283 Thursday July 24<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day thick overcast weather & very light breeze & very strong current setting to the Northward 5 Ship in sight. Latter part very thick fog & light wind Employed in ships duty
