Remarks On Thursday October 9th 1851.

361 First Part of this day Pleasant Engaged in fitting ship
for sea &c. three ships arrived at this Port
At 8 A.M. weighed anchor and towed down 49 fathoms
Sett all sail Laying off & on one boat on shore
So Ends At Lahaina

Remarks On Friday October 10th 1851

362 First Part of this day Moderate trades from N.E.
and Pleasant Laying off & on at Lahaina with
one boat on shore at 4 P.M. Boat returned
from shore and stored off for whale ground
Middle Part Light winds and also the latter part
Engaged in ship's duty So Ends

Latitude 20.22 North
Longitude 157.00 West

Remarks On Saturday October 11th 1851

363 First Part of this day Moderate trades and Pleasant
steering by to the south with all sail set
Engaged in ship's duty
Middle Part Strong trades latter part light breeze
and calm Employed in ship's duty So Ends

Latitude 19.22 North
Longitude 156.20 West

Remarks on Sunday October 12th 1851

364 light winds and pleasant weather steering S.E.
with all sail set
Middle part squally with a current setting to N.E.
Latter Part light strong trades and pleasant sail on
sail So Ends

Latitude 17.33 North
Longitude 155.55 West
