first part Light Trade Wind from the S.E.
443 and pleasant employed in chasing black
fish at 3 P.M. came in board steering East
with all sail set

Middle part going a back
Latter part steering East by P. with all sail
set employed in chasing the black fish So Ends

Latitude 12.36 South
Longitude 80.43 West

Remarks on Thursday January 1. 1852
first part Light S.E. Trade Wind and pleasant
444 steering by to the S.W. with all sail set employed
in chasing black fish saw five backs

Middle and Latter part
the same employed in chasing and
killing salt water So Ends
