 first part strong breeze from N.E.
 525 light and pleasant steering West by N.
 wind saw 2 seals employed in ships
 Duty Middle and latter part
 moderate breeze from N.E. and
 squally the land in sight and took
 in sail and saw two seals and
 main topmast and mast heading to the ship
 saw 2 seals So. by E.
