526 miles to point sailing to the S. E. the
land in sight saw one sail Middle part
more moderate latter part light wind
and calm at daylight with all sail being
by 3 P.M. last part of under 2 m.p.

Remarks on Tuesday March 28. 1852
first part light breeze and thick weather
527 last with all sail set saw 6 sails
steering for Cape Horn (English) in
ships Duty Middle part strong trade
and passing 2 ships then 2 passed for
Dubai with all sail set Sea calm

Remarks on Wednesday March 29. 1852
first part light breeze and steering S.W.
528 last all sails set and at 2 P.M. took
a pilot and at 4 P.M. bore the anchor
Middle part small ship latter part
employed in sweeping ships and coals
Doubt D passed Sea calm

Remarks on Thursday March 30. 1852
first part light winds and pleasant
529 and began at under employed in
ships Duty Middle and latter part
pleasant employed in breaking out
the ash and S.W. breeze

Remarks on Friday March 31. 1852
530 first part light winds and pleasant
employed in sweeping the air
Middle the same latter
employed in filling salt water
Sea calm
