545 First Part of these 24 hours come in with a
 strong wind from the S E carrying double reef
 top sails lying off and on the harbor
 Honolulu at 4 P M took our departure from
 this place in company with the ship Endeavour
 of Edgartown Captain Fisher carrying all sail middle
 part rainy latter part the same saw nothing
 so ends

 saw nothing but the Splendid carrying all sail

549 This day comes in with a light winds
 from the E Steering W by S at 2 P M took
 a ship standing to the W at 4 P M got through
 clearing up between decks middle and latter
 part fine weather saw no sails standing to the
 W watches employed bending the fore sail and
 a mainsail so ends
