555 First part of these 24 hours comes in with a fine
from the N.E. heading S.W. and S.W. by S. Carrying

556 Remarks on Board Friday April 23rd 1852

This day comes in with a strong breeze from the E
N.E. Steering S.W. Employed in painting our

Boats at 4 P.M. commenced heavy rain and squalls
took in the top gallant sails and double reefed
the top sails took in the sliding sail and furlled
the mainsail at 6 P.M. took in the mizen top sail
The weather looked very bad latter part more
mist made all sail wind came to the west and
blew up saw 1 finback and a plenty of feed
Encamping with the splendid &c and this day

Lat by Obs 32 = 27 N
Long by Chrs 171 = 10 E

557 Remarks on Board Saturday April 24th 1852

First part of these 24 hours comes in with
a light wind from the S.W. heading N.E.
At 4 P.M. wind wind came back to the west
steering S by the wind middle part the same
latter part wind came to the north
Ship heading W by the wind came in foggy lost
sight of the splendid saw 2 finback patches
Employed in ships duty &c and this day

558 Remarks on Board Sunday April 25th 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze from the
S.W. heading W by N in the wind took
in middle part the same latter part more ship heading
W by N for let up saw a school of blackfish led by
boats and struck one and took him a long side
and killed him in front forward the main yard
got dinner &c and this day all as well

Long by Chrs 171 = 30 West



559 Remarks on Board Monday April 26th 1852

This day comes in with a light wind from
the W by N heading in the wind N and S by E
Employed in clearing away our blackfish at 2
P.M. got through with fine weather coming all
sail middle and latter part the same saw a number
of finback and caught a tubel packed employed in fixing
the winches and other jobs &c and this day

Lat by Obs 32 = 01 North
Long by Chrs 171 = 52 West

560 Remarks on Board Tuesday April 27th 1852

This day commences with a light wind from the
W by N Steering N by W 1/2 W at 4 P.M. had calm
and fine weather middle part the same latter
part light winds and cloudy saw some finback
Employed in picking over potatoes and other
jobs &c and this day all right

Lat by Obs 32 = 26 North
Long same this day
