561 Remarks on Board Wednesday April 28 1852

This part of these 24 hours comes in with a light breeze from the South steering N by W 1/2 W at 8 P M Capt has N by W sailing all sail at 2 P M got through our station middle part fine weather at 4 P M commenced raining from the S W and went a fine breeze carrying all sail saw nothing watches employed in ships duty so ends this day all as well

562 Remarks on Board Thursday 29 1852

This day commences with a strong breeze with rain from the S W steering N by W carrying all sail at 2 P M wind came to the N N W and went fresh took in all sail but the main top sail and fore sail and have her to doing strong gail some cloudy middle part the same latter part more fresh at 5 P M got double reef top sails saw nothing watches employed in making your charge so ends this day

Long by Chro 172 = 22

563 Remarks on Board Friday 30 April 1852

This day comes in with a strong breeze from the S W heading on the wind to the N E carrying double reef top sails middle part the same at 4 P M more fresh made all sail saw nothing watches employed in making our blackfish saw nothing so ends this day

Long by Chro 172 = 00

564 Remarks on Board Saturday May 1 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze from the N N W heading N by N commencing hilling but few blackfish and clearing but few goats at 6 P M got through and have ship heading N E with a light breeze carrying all sail middle part light winds and pleasant at 8 P M wind came to the S E top must studying sail with a light breeze from the South saw nothing so ends this day watches employed in ships duty

Lat by Obs 34 = 30
Long by Chro 171 = 46

565 Remarks on Board Sunday May 2 1852

This day comes in with pleasant weather and a fair wind from the South steering N N W carrying all sail middle and latter part the same saw nothing so ends this day

Latitude by Obs 37 = 19 North
Longitude by Chro 171 = 43

566 Remarks on Board Monday May 3 1852

This day commences with a strong breeze from the S W steering N N W carrying all sail at 6 P M doing fresh took in the standing sail main top gallant

Sail and main sail doing fresh attended with rain middle part the same latter part more fresh made all sail wind came to the N N W and did away below saw a school of blackfish loved and cast but no success came on board except of 1 P M light was from the South set top must studying sail so ends this
