 573 Remarks On Board Monday May 10th 1852

This day comes in with a strong breeze from the
 W⁸ S^W Steering N^W 1/2 S^W carrying all sail at 8 A.M. it
 breezed on track in the main top gallant sail
 And by 10 and 11 o'clock at 3 o'clock reefed the
 Topsails took in the fore and main sail thick snow
 storm at 4 P.M. took in the fore sail and close reefed
 the main top sail and luffed by the wind heading
 W⁸ blowing a heavy gale and a thick snow storm
 Wind from the W⁸ S^W and nothing so ends this day

574 Remarks On Board Tuesday May 11th 1852

This day comes in with a strong gale from the
 West blowing to under a close reef main top sail
 heading N^W 1/2 W⁸ middle and latter part the same
 and nothing so ends this day

575 Remarks On Board Wednesday May 12th 1852

This day comes in with a moderate gale from
 the same old gale heading N^W 1/2 W⁸ at 2 P.M. set

The fore sail middle part more under set double
 W⁸ W⁸ keep top sail latter part made all sail wind
 backed to the W⁸ S^W heading on the wind at 4 P.M.
 at 4 P.M. saw to right rapidly going fast to west
 but did not have under the main top gallant sail
 And bent a new one and mended the old one
 so ends this day

576 Remarks On Board Thursday May 13th 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze from the
 W⁸ S^W heading N^W 1/2 W⁸ at 3 P.M. took ship heading
 W⁸ S^W with a strong breeze at 4 P.M. took ship
 from heading N^W 1/2 W⁸ middle part took in the
 light sails and singled reefed the fore and main
 top sails latter part more under set them again
 The wind baffled a bout said a number of fin-
 backs so ends this day

577 Remarks On Board Friday May 14th 1852

First part of this day comes in with a strong
 breeze from the W⁸ heading N^W 1/2 W⁸ close hull on
 the wind some squalls middle part the same at 6
 P.M. took ship heading W⁸ S^W at 8 P.M. wind calmed
 took ship a gain heading N^W 1/2 W⁸ and the land with
 it called the Fox Islands but seeing no other signs for
 them at 11 A.M. took ship a gain said nothing so
 ends this day got a lunar observation by the sun
 and moon

578 Remarks On Board Saturday May 15th 1852

This day comes in with a light wind from
 the N^W heading W⁸ S^W and in light barney
 N^W distance of 40 miles covered with snow
 middle part calm and light breeze from the N^W Steering
 N^W 1/2 W⁸ latter a breeze from the N^W heading W⁸
 saw the land and a number of finbacks so ends this
