 579 Remarks on Board Sunday May 16th 1852

First part of these 24 hours comes in with a strong
 breeze from the S.W. heading W by S at 2 P.M. took
 in the fly, top and mizen top. Gallant sail at 3
 P.M. tacked ship to gain heading S.W. wind came
 more to the west at 11 P.M. tacked to gain wind
 came to the north at 3 P.M. tacked to gain
 heading S by E. Saw nothing of the land. Some
 cloudy and a number of pinbacks so ends this day

580 Remarks on Board Monday May 17th 1852

First part of these 24 hours comes in with a
 light breeze from the west steering by the wind
 heading S.W. carrying all sail at 4 P.M. saw the
 West End of Fox Islands bearing E by E distance
 about 6 miles by our reckoning at 6 P.M. sent our
 boats out on the cranes all most calm at 4 P.M.
 A light breeze from the W.S.W. middle part calm latter
 part a fine breeze from the south got top most standing
 sail wind came to the S.W. steering S.W. by S. Saw
 a number of pinbacks so ends this day

581 Remarks on Board Tuesday May 18th 1852

First part of these 24 hours comes in with a
 fine breeze from the S.W. steering S.W. by W. carrying
 all sail middle part the same latter wind came
 more to the west. Saw some pinbacks fine pleasant
 weather watches employed in cleaning out the
 pots so ends this day

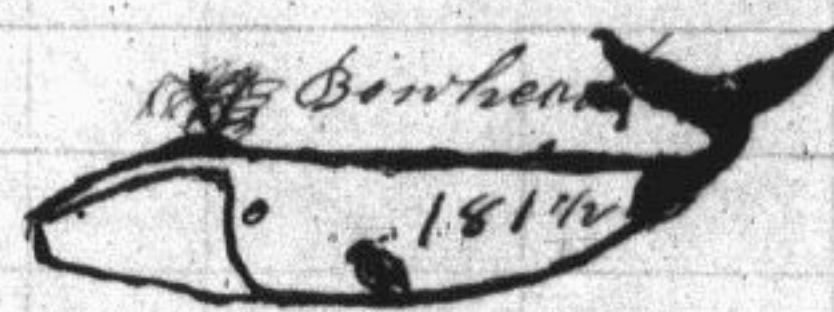
The Arctic Ocean Captain Owen Fisher
 582 Remarks on Board Wednesday May 19th 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze from the
 S.W. steering S.W. by W. carrying all sail at 5 P.M. calm
 and no wind a tall fine pleasant weather middle
 part calm at 6 P.M. a light breeze sprang up from
 the W.S.W. heading S and S by E. Saw nothing so ends

Lat by Obs 56 - 58
 Long by Chro 168 = 50

583 Remarks on Board Thursday May 20th 1852

First part of this day comes in with a light
 breeze from the W.S.W. heading S by E at 3 P.M.
 Saw one dolphin bottom fine pleasant weather
 middle part the same at 6 P.M. saw a porpoise
 leaped and struck and killed him took him
 along side with fine weather. Saw 2 sails
 so ends this day all is well



Lat by Obs 58 = 00
 Long none this day

584 Remarks on Board Friday May 21st 1852

Comes in with fine weather commenced
 cutting at 11 P.M. got through cleared
 up the watch and started the works
 middle part the same at 4 P.M. more ship
 heading W by S. Saw nothing watches employed
 in drying so ends this day
