E middle part closed down the topsails latter
part made all sail heading N by W at 8 A.M.
the ship heading W by N and a full steering to
the north and no whales employed in fishing
to winds this day

589 Remarks On Board Sunday May ^{the} 23 1852

This commenced with fine weather and light
winds from the N.W. at 1 P.M. came in thick fog
steering on the wind heading W by N at 11 P.M.
the ship heading S.E. wind backed to the N.E.
fog cleared up at 8 A.M. Capt of W. sent a ship named
Plover and spoke her it was the boat brother of
New Bedford and the captain went on board and
number of fishbacks employed in fishing to winds
this day

587 Remarks On Board Monday May ^{the} 24

This day comes in with a strong breeze from the
N.E. double reefed the top sails at 2 P.M. took
them in at 6 took in the fore sail and
have fire to the wind heading E.S.E. at 11 P.M.
got through byling latter sent strong gails and
sent back to sails watches employed in lashing
up the oil to winds this day

588 Remarks On Board Tuesday May ^{the} 25 1852

First part of these 24 hours comes in with a
strong gail from the N.E. heading E.S.E. at
2 P.M. more moderate wind backed to the
north middle part the same latter part the wind
backed to the W.N.W. made no sail at 8 A.M.
commenced steering down sent a sail standing
to the north to winds this day

589 Remarks On Board Wednesday May ^{the} 26 1852

This day comes in with a strong breeze from
the N.W. heading N.W. yet impeded in steering
down at 8 P.M. got through cleaned up back to
the watch middle part the same at 8 A.M. got down
the reef top sails Capt of N.E. sent to ship standing
in to the S.W. sent some fishback to winds this

590 Remarks On Board Thursday May ^{the} 27

This day comes in with a light breeze from
the W. steering to the S.E. sent a plenty of
fishback carrying double reef top sails middle
part the same latter part made all sail fine
weather saw nothing watches employed in ship's
duty both as bending the main top gallant sail
and sent down the mizen top gallant yard
and sail and so forth to winds this day
