This day comes in with strong breeze from the E. N.E. at 4 P.M. capt of S.W. in company with the Orion caring all sail middle part the same latter part more modest came in thick fog and rain saw nothing so ends this day very disagreeable but live in hopes of better times here after

593 Remarks On Board Sunday May ^{the} 30 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze from the North steering to the South with thick fog middle part the same latter part some foggy but a sail steering the same way that sea way but saw no whaling watches employed in ceasing Sunday so ends this day all of us thin yet some sick

This day comes in with a light breeze from the East steering to the West at 4 P.M. saw 7 sails but none of them doing any thing middle part foggy had to at 1 P.M. cleared up capt of S.W. saw a number of ships spoke the Consack of New Bedford Captain came on board saw some grampsons so ends this day

595 Remarks On Board June Sunday ^{the} 1 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze from the N.W. steering to the S.W. at 2 P.M. saw 2 Belheads lashed and struck and quartered the live boats came on board chased him with the ship as long as sea cold tall sea lashed on the wind at about 11 P.M. in the morning capt of S.W. saw the same whail to gain lashed our boats a struck the same whail to gain cut the line of with the 2 in came on board and lashed up so ends this day

Comes in with a fine breeze from the N.W. Last sight of the whail capt of S.W. saw nothing at 4 P.M. lashed on the wind heading S.W. by S at 5 P.M. saw ship heading N fine weather middle part calm latter part light breeze from the East saw some finbacks so ends this day
