602 Remarks On Board Wednesday June ^{the} 9 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze from the NE steering to the west betwixt to bidders of ice saw 16 boats after one ahead near saw 2 selfbottoms at 4 P.M. spoke the Electra of New London in company with the Catharine and Brigsburg. Middle part fog and light rain latter part clear. Saw 2 boats ahead and chased but no success. Came on board saw 2 ships to byline so ends

603 Remarks On Board Thursday June ^{the} 10 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze from the NE steering to the NW middle part saw 2 boats ahead and chased got close on but did not strike thick fog latter part the fog cleared up. Saw 10 ships 2 of them were byline spoke the Alice Marshall of New Bedford with one whal so ends this day

604 Remarks On Board Friday June ^{the} 11 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze from the South wind in today the ice and run the ice down saw saw 2 boats ahead and chased but no success. Came on board stood off from the ice to the SE middle part rainy and thick with a strong breeze latter part the rain at 4 P.M. took in the ice and main sail saw 3 sails so ends this day

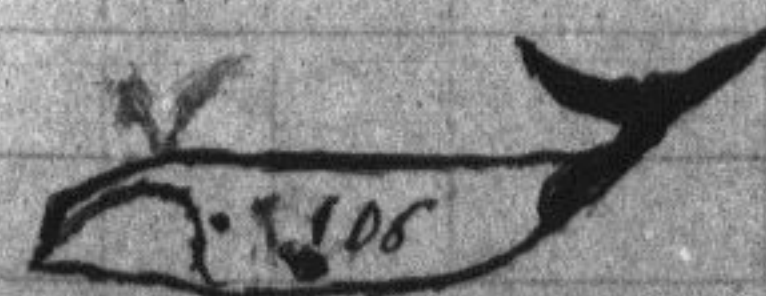
On Board Sunday June ^{the} 13 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze from the SW steering to the NW with thick fog saw 3 sails one of them to byline middle part fine weather stood in for the land at 3 A.M. saw the land those ships it came in thick fog at 10 P.M. lit up saw one ahead and chased but no success. Came on board and histed up so ends

607 Remarks On Board Monday June ^{the} 14 1852

This day comes in with thick weather with rain saw a plenty of boats ahead and struck one and took him a long ride and made him part land bearing W distance of 10 miles heading off shore at 2 P.M. commenced cutting with fine weather saw a number of ships to byline and some whals but they were very wild at 12 got through cutting so ends this day
