614 Remarks On Board Monday June ^{the} 21 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze from the North Stearing on the wind heading E. N. E. at 4 P. M. saw a number of ships some cutting some a whaling and we saw some land and chased but got nothing came in thick fog here the main yard A back and let her lay until 8 P. M. saw some more whails land and chased until 11 P. M. got nothing came in thick again latter part cleared up some saw more whails land and chased but got nothing whails very wild so ends this day

615 Remarks On Board Tuesday June ^{the} 22 1852

This day commences with fine fog yet of a chasing aheads saw a plenty but got none plenty of ships during the faint middle part the wind shifted so the South in the morning the fog cleared up saw a ahead land and struck and killed him took him a long side and got dinner so ends

Remarks On Board Wednesday June ^{the} 23 1852

616 First Part of this day comes in with fine weather commenced cutting a 1 P. M. spoke the allie praiser of New Bedford like wise the Barre Harvest of fair heaven Captain came on board at 7 P. M. got through cutting started the work middle part thick fog latter part clear saw no whails but plenty of ships spoke the crewman of New Bedford went on board and got our line that we lost he caught the whail & byled him out with made him 100 lbs. so ends employed byling

617 Remarks On Board Thursday June ^{the} 24 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze from the North standing in shore spoke the heard of New Bedford at 9 P. M. saw 4 ships in the sea off warader saw the ice but no whails took a round latter part steered to the E. S. E. thick fog so ends employed in byling

618 Remarks On Board Friday June ^{the} 25 1852

This day comes in with a calm and fog Stearing so the E. S. E. at 4 P. M. it let up some saw a ship but finally shut down a gain at 9 P. M. got through byling latter part some fog at 8 P. M. commenced Stearing down saw a plenty of ships doing nothing so ends this day

620 Remarks On Board Saturday June ^{the} 26 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze from the East Stearing to the South employed in Stearing down at 8 P. M. got through thick fog halled the main yard a back got the watch latter part let up breast forward stood to the N. E. saw nothing but ships were ship double reefed the topsails so ends
