This day comes in with a strong breeze from the North heading to the west at 2 P.M. took in the fore and misson topsail and hove her to the West at 2 P.M. were ship heading E.N.E. at 8 A.M. Capt of S.E. Carrying the fore and double reef main topsail saw nothing but ships so ends this day

622 Remarks On Board Monday June 28th 1852

This day comes in with a moderate gail from the North heading to the S.E. at 2 P.M. hove to heading to the E.N.E. at 6 P.M. Capt of a gain on the wind Old Course Carrying the fore sail and main topsail At 9 P.M. saw the ice lapped to on the wind heading to the west saw a plenty of ships and a number of whails were ship heading to the N.E. saw the land blowing strong so ends this day

This day comes in with a strong gail from the North heading to the N.E. saw a number of whails pass the ship to the north at 4 P.M. lured and chased but got nothing very near at 2 P.M. were ship heading to the N.E. at 4 P.M. got double topsails stood in there saw nothing but ships so ends

This day comes in with a strong gail from the North took in the fore and misson topsail. Now ship heading to the N.E. at 2 commenced sail some snow middle and latter part more moderate all sail and the sea likewise the land were ship stood off there saw a plenty of ships but no whails so ends this day with hard looking

625 Remarks On Board Thursday July 1st 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze and calm from the N.E. heading on the wind to the S.E. At 6 P.M. light breeze from the N.W. with fog clearing to the N.E. saw 3 ships a sailing and one a cutting middle part light winds and thick fog latter part the same saw a number of boats lured and chased but got nothing spoke the Singora of West-Redford with 4 whails this season so ends this day

This day comes in with thick fog and calm here the main topsail to the mast at 4 P.M. let up some braced forward but saw no whails one bark a cutting middle part the same latter part stood in for the sea saw the sea were ship stood off from the sea in thick fog so ends this day
