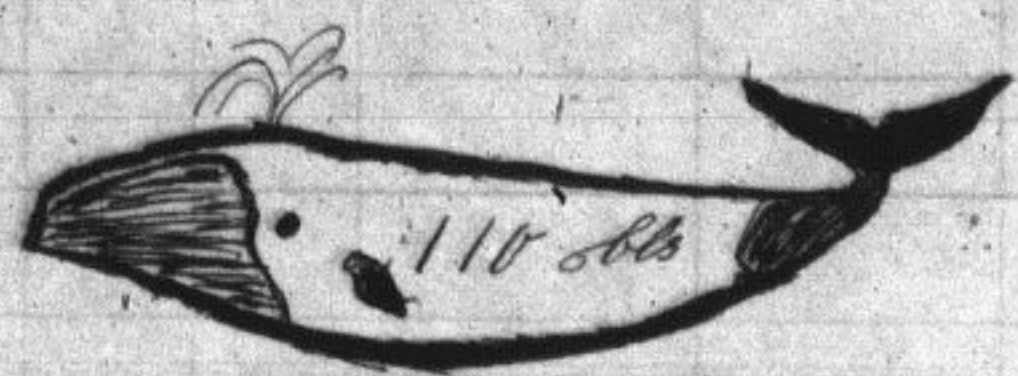


This Is Whaling of Cape Shadus

627 Remarks on Board Saturday July ^{the} 3 1852

This day comes in with thick fog heading of from the sea at 4 P.M. let up some sail to ahead and struck and killed him took him A long side and commenced cutting with thick fog and rain at 2 P.M. got through and cleared up decks started the work saw which loved and chased but got nothing saw a plenty of ships cutting and byling ice in sight so ends this day

Remarks on Board Sunday July ^{the} 4 1852

628 This day commencing with fine weather and a light breeze from the south lying of and on the sea sent the boats in to sea what they could see sea a number of aheads but got none came on board got supper got the watch middle saw the land was ship stood of there saw whails loved and chased thick live parted saw a plenty more in the sea came on board got dinner so ends this day saw 40 ships

629 Remarks on Board Monday July ^{the} 5 1852

This day comes in with fine weather saw Whails loved and struck and drew from him Squatting thick blue lost him came on board got the watch middle part strong breeze stood in the side and missew top sail in the morning let them a gain more modest but whails loved and chased with no success came on board more ship for the sea saw no more whails employed in byling so ends

630 Remarks on Board Tuesday July ^{the} 6 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze from the south steering for the sea loved one boat and went on to sea what hea cold sea saw nothing there ship and stood of a gain went on board of Haribal of New London middle part saw whails loved and chased but got nothing latter part saw more whails loved and got one thick fog took him a long side got dinner so ends this day all night

Remarks on Board Wednesday July ^{the} 7 1852

631 This day comes in with a calm commenced cutting thick fog at 6 P.M. got through saw the sea saw ship heading N by W middle part cleared up decks started the work latter part clear untill 9 P.M. came in thick a gain saw whails loved and chased but got nothing saw a plenty of ships and plenty see so ends in byling

632 Remarks on Board Thursday July ^{the} 8 1852

This day comes in with thick fog saw nothing but ships and see plenty of that at 6 P.M. run through heavy sea double reefed the top sails lying a ball At 7 P.M. took in the fore and missew top sail middle part cleared up so that we could see saw some ships but no see bliny fresh latter part the Sain saw a number of whails but Regid that we did not love employed in byling so ends
