First part of this day comes in with strong winds and fog lying to under a double reef main topsail and fore sail heading S.E. and S. by E. middle part got through by lying at S. and commenced steering down in the main hatch but nothing about a few ships so ends this day in thick fog

This day comes in with a strong breeze from the South West ship heading west thick fog yet improved in steering down at 8 P.M. got through when the stowed down 2:10 A.M. got supper but the main middle part thick fog in the morning commenced steering down latter part got through but nothing but one ship so ends this day

This day comes in with a strong breeze from the S.W. lying to under a foresail and main top sail thick fog heading S.E. at 2 P.M. saw one ship at 7 P.M. took the bearings of N. Bedford middle part got up some but the fore and main top sails were ship but nothing but ships no land nor ice latter part were ship a gain but hull top sails saw 6 ships a cutting so ends

This day comes in with fine pleasant weather Wind from the S.W. steering N.W. for the land carrying hull top sails and covers but a number of ships and some carboys but no whaling middle part fine weather made all sail wind shifted so the S.E. latter part thick and rainy at 9 A.M. were ship heading S. and a number of ships but no whaling so ends this day
