640 Remarks On Board Friday July ^{the} 16th 1852

This day comes in with a strong gale from the
E.N.E. heading off shore S.E. land in sight lying
under a double reef main top sail fore sail furled
saw one ahead middle part under head. Got the
works started the works some rain yet likewise
fog saw nothing but one ship to and fro this day

641 Remarks On Board Saturday July ^{the} 17th 1852

This day comes in with fog at 2 P.M. cleared up
saw the land made sail wind shifted to the
West were ship steered for the land saw one
Whale but a number of ships middle part the
gain in the morning kept off for the land went
in there near the land down a long shore but saw
no which wind from the South this land is
called the Cape North at the Entrance of Bearing
Strait to and fro employed in byline

Wind from the South steering for St. Lawrence Island
at 3 P.M. saw a plenty of whales loved and struck
one took him a long side commenced cutting at
2 P.M. got through got the watch cleared up decks
Wind shifted to the N.W. were ship plenty of wha-
les in sight but going with to the West saw
A number of ships some a byline and some a cutting
to and fro this day in byline

This day comes in with fine pleasant weather
Saw a plenty of whales but very wild loved
and chased night and day and got nothing
it was very calm latter part a fine breeze blowing
up from the South commenced steering down land
A whaling saw a number of californian gales for
the first but a thousand whales to and fro

643 Remarks On Board Tuesday July ^{the} 20th 1852

This day comes in with a strong breeze from the
South took in the fore and mizen top sails
but still employed in steering down at 5 got
through saw a number of whales loved to boats
and whilst they were gone saw a crest a small
whale took him a long side and cut him in latter
part got through fine weather saw a plenty of
ships and summer whails to and fro this day
