 South steering to the north at 2 P.M. saw a lot of
 boheads bound to the north loved and chased but
 got none came on board except of 11 saw a ship to

 Simons at 11 A.M. saw more land exposed to sea the East
 Cape bore from us west about 4 leagues saw a number
 of ships and a plenty of boheads but very wild
 loved and chased but got nothing to and this
