650 Remarks on Board Tuesday July ^{the} 27 1852

This day comes in with light breezes from the S.E. with much fog lying with the main yard to back at 6 P.M. fell in with a ship & cutting watch was the Monticello Montucket with 9 whalers. This season middle part lit up some more ships saw nothing of the land till morning then it lit up so that we saw the land on both sides East Cape bare ground as most winds S.W. by S. it came in thick & some more ships have the head yards to back and lay still heading E by S under double reef topsails sails so ends this day all as well

651 Remarks on Board Wednesday July ^{the} 28 1852

This day comes in with thick fog and rain lying to back drifts to the north employed in getting up shoals middle part cleared up some more ships in the morning saw ship & gain and kept of a gain to the S.E. saw 4 sails the hutusoff of New Bedford Captain came on board saw no whalers so ends this day

652 Remarks on Board Thursday July ^{the} 29 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze from the E steering to the S.E. saw nothing but some grain sailing all sail some smoky middle part the same saw ship to the south saw nothing but calapanian grain so ends this day

653 Remarks on Board Friday July ^{the} 30 1852

This day comes in with thick fog and calm heading South at 4 P.M. lit up some saw a ship then run down and spoke in it was the gain of New Bedford Captain Went on board to get the more middle and latter part the same saw no whalers this day so ends this

654 Remarks on Board Saturday July ^{the} 31 1852

This day comes in with light breeze from the E heading to the South with thick fog at 5 P.M. lit up some saw 2 ships near down to us it was the ^{Commander} of Sag Harbor middle part lay a back heading to the South latter part lit up some saw 5 ships and 3 caribees employed in getting up shoals so ends this day

655 Remarks on Board Sunday August ^{the} 1 1852

This day comes in with a light wind from the N.E. heading to the S.E. until 4 P.M. were ship to the North some foggy saw 2 sails standing to the north at 7 saw 2 caribees through the fog took them to sea but boats but not so were ship heads them saw they were caribees middle and latter part calm saw nothing but calapanian grain so ends this day
