This day comes in with a light breeze from the N.W. heading to the south saw a quantity of grass and one sail middle part fine weather latter part the same saw nothing but 3 ships spoke the baron of Bagharbar this day employed in looking out for blubber in the fore peak so ends this day

This day comes in with a light breeze from the N.W. heading to the N.E. saw nothing grass some foggy at 6 P.M. got through looking out cleared up 2 o'clock saw a ship a sailing middle part clear except of west end from that to N.W. latter part saw a number of carasses but no whails employed in setting up shrocks so ends this day

659 Remarks On Board Thursday August ^{the} 5 1852

This day comes in with fine weather light winds from the E.N.E. steering to the north saw a quantity of calaporia grass and 4 ships spoke one it was the baron of werberford Captain went on board to get the name middle part fine weather latter part the same saw nothing but grass one dead one employed in cleaning out the fore hatch so ends

660 Remarks On Board Friday August ^{the} 6 1852

This day comes in with fine clear weather wind from the N.E. steering to the N.W. at 3 P.M. saw a Bohead going fast to the N.E. luffed on the wind came in foggy at 7 Capt of a gain to the N.W. middle part it cleared up steering S.W. latter part thick fog saw nothing employed in setting up pipes shrocks so ends this day with thick fog as usual

661 Remarks On Board Saturday August ^{the} 7 1852

This day comes in with a light breeze from the E.N.E. sailing with the main yard a back with thick fog heading to the S.E. at 5 P.M. grounded and got 23 fathoms middle part fog latter part clear more ship so the north saw nothing but one sail went back to the S.E. at 10 A.M. saw a ship a sailing so ends this day
