This day comes in with thick fog land rising Laying a back heading to the East at 6 PM Lat by same saw 3 Ships middle part thick fog with the main yard a back in the morning Capt of SSG saw 2 whalers but did not have time to go from the north saw 6 Ships a running of to the South one of them a whaler so under this

 695 Remarks On Board Friday Sept ^{the} 10 1852

This day comes in with a strong breeze from the North Steering to the SE with thick fog in company with others carrying all sail at 8 AM luffed on the wind with the main yard a back thick fog At 5 PM Capt of SSG for the Straits at 7 AM made the land which is called the East Cape of the Russian Shore at 12 it bore N from us distance of 8 miles Saw 3 Ships a Steering the same way so under

696 Remarks On Board Saturday Sept ^{the} 11 1852

This day comes in with a strong breeze from the NW Steering S by W 3 Ships in sight near by the Straits which is called Bearing Straits with the Russian Shore a back at 12 it came in thick Lat here came to the wind with the main yard a back at 4 AM Capt of a gain SSW a long the land At 11 AM past Cape North saw 6 Ships a Steering the same course and a plenty of geese so under this day
