This day comes in with a light breeze from the S.E. heading E carrying all sail at 11 P.M. calm at 2 A.M. light breeze from the S.E. more ship to the South at 4 A.M. wind shifted to the old corner more ship again to the East at 10 A.M. more to the South again being fresh with rain saw a sail standing to the East so ends this day employed in ships duty

719 Remarks On Board Tuesday Oct ^{the} 5 1852

This day comes in with a strong breeze from the S.E. heading to the S.W. at 2 P.M. more ship to the East At 4 P.M. some squally took in the fore top and main top gallant sail like wise main middle part double reef The fore and main latter part more modest turned out the reefs got the main top gallant and a ship and spoke her it was the Olympia Norfolk with 10 sails this season so ends this day

This day comes in with a strong breeze from the S.E. heading E by S carrying all sail in company with Olympia middle part some squally wind shifted to the north but some came back to the old place latter part the main at 10 A.M. tacked ship to the South so ends this day
