

The Ship heaving
1500 strokes in 24 hours

806 *Remarks Wednesday Jan 5th 1853*
This day commences with strong
gales and frequent squalls of rain
from the S. East at 8 P.M. finished
stowing, double reefed the topsails
and set them at 4 P.M. hauled
the mizzen topsail middle part
the same. Lashed fast heavy gale
hauling the foretopail

Obs Lat 24.22 South Long 152.43 West

807 *Remarks Thursday Jan 6th 1853*
This day comes with a fresh gale
and passing clouds from S East
the ship on the larboard tack
heading S.S. West under double
reefed main topsail and foresail

Middle and Lashed part the
same at 8 A.M. set fore and
mizzen topsails double reefed

808 *Remarks Friday Jan 7th 1853*
This day commences with fresh
gales and squalls of wind and
rain from S. East the ship
on the larboard tack heading
S.W. by South and S.S. West under
double reef and foresail

Middle and Lashed part the same

Obs Lat 23.10 South Long 152.44 West

809 *Remarks Saturday Jan 8th 1853*
This day commences with strong
gales and rain from S. East
the ship on the larboard tack
heading South under double reefed
main and mizzen topsail and
foresail middle part the same

Lashed part close reefed the main
topsail wind from S. East

Obs Lat 23.02 South Long 152.49 West

810 *Remarks Sunday Jan 9th 1853*
This day commences with strong
gales and frequent rain from
S. East the ship on the wind on
the larboard tack heading S. East
at 2 P.M. more moderate S.E. fore
topsail and mainsail

Middle part pleasant Lashed
part set all sail steering S. East
at 11 A.M. a fresh gale hauled
main top & sail

Obs Lat 30.29 South Long 152.05 West

811 *Remarks Monday Jan 10th 1853*
This day commences with fresh
gales and pleasant from S. East
steering S. East under double
reef and mizzen

Middle and Lashed part the same
at 10 A.M. set single reefed topsail

Obs Lat 31.18 South Long 151.22 West
