848 Remarks Wednesday February 16th 1753

This day commenced with strong winds and passing clouds from S. E. East of and on at Juan Fernandez at 8 P.M. Double reefed the topsails middle and latter part the same a boat on shore one sail in sight

849 Remarks Thursday February 17th 1753

This day commences with brisk breezes and passing clouds from South the ship off and on Juan Fernandez at 5 P.M. the boats returned with a load of potatoes, middle and latter part much the same

850 Remarks Friday February 18th 1753

This day at 7 P.M. Charles E. Luke John Gullery William Hays was put on board of the ship

This day commenced with brisk breezes and passing clouds from S. S. West of and on Juan Fernandez at 2 P.M. received a boat load of wood from the shore middle part calm

This day discharged Jeremiah Smith with his consent to go on board Brig Semilla of Chilmark

Latter part light breezes and pleasant from S. S. West the ship by the wind heading S. East with all sail set at 9 P.M. saw one Spanish whale going fast to the westward board chased without success

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851 Remarks Saturday February 19th 1753

This day commenced with brisk breezes and pleasant the ship by the wind heading S. S. East and sail in sight at Island being 10 P.M. 30 miles distant middle part the same latter part tacked ship to the Westward with all sail set one ship in sight

852 Remarks Sunday February 20th 1753

This day commences with brisk breezes and pleasant from S. West the ship by the wind on the Starboard tack heading S. West middle and latter part the same

Obs Lat 34.34 South Long 119.30th West

853 Remarks Monday February 21th 1753

This day commences with brisk breezes and pleasant from S. S. East the ship by the wind on the Starboard tack middle and latter part the same

Obs Lat 35.19 South Long 81.35 West
