This day commences with light winds
and pleasant from S. West the ship
by the wind on the starboard tack
heading S. East, one sail in situ.

Middle and latter part much
the same at 2 P.M. wind from
S. East wore ship to the S. West
double reefed the fore topsail and
banded the mainmast.

This day commences with strong
winds and cloudy from S. East
the ship by the wind on the starboard
tack heading S. West.

and cloudy from South the ship by
the wind on the starboard tack
middle and latter part calm
latter part light breeze and plume
from S. West the ship by the wind
on the starboard tack

857 Remarks Friday February 25th 1853
This day commences with light wind
and pleasant from S. West the ship
by the wind on the starboard tack heading
S. East, middle and latter part light
winds and pleasant from West steering
S. by East.

858 Remarks Saturday February 26th 1853
This day commences with light wind
and pleasant from West steering
S. by East, middle and latter part
overcast weather, at 8 P.M. saw a school
of sperm whales going fast Eastward
board to boat in chase of them
after a long chase struck one and
took his to the ship

859 Remarks Sunday February 27th 1853
This day commences with light
air and calm with frequent
fog. Employed cutting at 4 P.M.
finished, middle part sailing and
light breeze from N. West steering S. East
latter thick overcast weather employed
baling and other necessary jobs aboard
the ship.
