

866 Remarks Sunday March 6th 1855

This day commences with strong winds and thick overcast weather from N. West steering S. E. by South at 6 P.M. set main top & sail

Middle part the same. Latter part strong winds and passing clouds from West steering E. S. East. Saw three ships and steering East and to on the wind heading N. W. W. S.

867 Remarks Monday March 7th 1855

This day commences with strong winds and frequent squalls of wind and rain from West steering East by South

Middle and Latter part much the same steering East

Obs Lat 56.42 South Long 14.02 W

868 Remarks Tuesday March 8th 1855

This day commences with strong winds and passing clouds from West steering E. by N. W.

Middle part strong winds and rain from N. East the ship on the barbed tack at 9 A.M. the wind shifted suddenly to the westward steered E. N. East under short sail Latter part much the same, a large sea running and frequent squalls in on deck

869 Remarks Wednesday March 9th 1855

This day commences with strong gales and a large sea from S. W. steering E. N. East under close reefed main top sail and fore sail the ship making very bad weather of it stowed the barbed which was turned up on the crane, at 4 P.M. hauled the fore sail and hove to on the starboard tack Middle and latter part here would not set all sail steered N. East to sail in site

870 Remarks Thursday March 10th 1855

This day commences with light breeze and passing clouds from West steering N. East with all sail set to sail in site, middle part the same Latter part light breeze and frequent squalls of rain and wind and sail in site

Obs Lat 56.06 South Long 16.22 W

871 Remarks Friday March 11th 1855

This day commences with strong winds and frequent squalls of wind and rain from West steering N. E. by N. W. to sail in site, Middle and latter part much the same nothing in sight

Obs Lat 54.22 South Long 16.22 W
