

Ship W^m West from the SandwichThursday Mar 30th A.D. 1854

This day fresh breeze and pleasant the Ship Rossignol and the bark Louisa arrive at the Ship's Bay and Eagle sailed at 3 P.M. the Capt. came on board with a letter from George to go with it at 4 P.M. got under way and stood out in company with several ships. Ends this day

Friday Mar 31st 1854 Sea Account

First part fresh breeze from S.E. W. and pleasant at 3 P.M. all a board a trial at the Ship's Bay and the anchors fired and the Ship's powder I. R. Top side board for Wahoo Middle and latter parts fresh breeze from W. N. W. and pleasant the Ship on different tacks working off between Ranae and Morotoi the Ship's Bay in company at 4 A.M. ran off to the seaward of Morotoi on purpose of getting the trades Lat. 6. 05. 21. 14 N. Long. by Chron. 156. 37 W.

Saturday April 1st 1854

This day comes with fresh breeze from W. S. W. and pleasant steering by the wind on both tacks and the Ship of Maui and Morotoi to S. W. of us the Ship's working to S. W. at 4 P.M. the wind changes to S. W. by W. Middle part light air and calm at 8 P.M. saw a Comet in the Western bound latter parts light variable air from E. wind and pleasant steering West all sail out saw the Ship of Maui and Morotoi to S. S. W. and S. W. a Ship to S. of us the anchor employ in Ship's duties this day Lat. 2. 1. 2. 2 N. Long. by Chron. 156. 59 W.

Sunday April 2nd 1854

First part light breeze from E. S. E. and pleasant steering W. by S. the land and 2 sail in sight put a gun boat on the water crosses and give us the 2nd mate Middle and latter parts light breeze from E. wind the Ship's working little headway Morotoi in sight to S. S. W. Wahoo in sight to W. and this Ends this day

Monday April 3rd 1854

First part light breeze from all points of the compass the Ship's working towards Demohed head where bears W. by S. dist 12 miles Middle and latter parts light variable air from W. wind pleasant weather the Ship's working to windward for Honolulu at 4 A.M. launched the Star boat and pulled 11 miles to the town the Capt. in the boat the Ship lay off and on several others in company this Ends this day

Islands to the Sea of Cebotok April 1854

Tuesday April 4th 1854

First part light breeze from N. E. by N. and pleasant steering off and on in company with 6 ships at 12 M. the boat came off with letters Middle and latter parts fresh breeze from N. E. and pleasant steering off and on at Honolulu the Capt. on shore at 8 A.M. sent the Star boat on shore which returned with one of 6 Brandis's gun 17 others sail lying off on 5 sail at anchor here this Ends this day

Wednesday April 5th 1854

First part fresh breeze from N. E. at 12 M. the Capt. came off with a boatster named Wm. Wood to go to the north with us and squared the yards for the Okeotok Middle and latter parts fresh N. E. trades with pleasant weather steering W. by S. all sail out the water employ in fitting boats saw a sail to S. W. this Ends this day Lat. by Chron. 2. 03. 22 N. Long by Chron. 161. 27 W.

Thursday April 6th 1854

First part strong breeze from N. E. by E. and pleasant steering W. by S. all sail out saw nothing Middle and latter parts strong breeze from N. E. and some rain saw nothing steering W. by S. all sail out the water employ in fitting boats this Ends this day Lat. by Chron. 2. 05. 50 N. Long by Chron. 164. 31 W.

Friday April 7th 1854

First part strong breeze from N. E. by E. and pleasant steering W. by S. all sail out saw a sail in the bound 2 of our passengers flew off Middle and latter parts fresh wind from N. E. by E. and overcast steering W. by S. saw nothing this Ends this day Lat. by Chron. 2. 08. 11 N. Long by Chron. 168. 25 W.

Saturday April 8th 1854

First part fresh N. E. trades and some overcast steering W. by S. all sail out Middle and latter part strong breeze from N. E. and pleasant steering W. all sail out saw a Ship to S. W. of us nothing more this Ends this day Lat. by Chron. 2. 12. 04 N. Long by Chron. 171. 52 W.

Sunday April 9th 1854

First part strong breeze from N. E. and pleasant steering W. by S. all sail out passed a large ship the Ship to harbor at 8 P.M. saw the Comet again Middle and latter parts fresh breeze from N. E. and with pleasant weather steering W. by S. all sail out saw a sail on the E. coast this Ends this day Lat. by Chron. 2. 22. 14 N. Long by Chron. 175. 17 W.
