Monday, April 10th A.D. 1854

First part strong breeze from N.E. by E. and pleasant steering W. by N. all sail out saw the land to windward passed near Peligato's Isle saw the boom of the land to S.W. Middle and latter parts fresh breeze from N.E. and pleasant weather steering W. by N. all sail out saw nothing this day
Lat. by Obs. 23° 48' N
Long by Chron. 178° 31' W

Tuesday, April 11th 1854

First part light breeze from N.E. and pleasant steering W. by N. all sail out saw nothing the watch employ in ships duties saw goat slightly indisposed caused by eating an overdose of white lead and paint Middle and latter part light breeze from N.E. by E. and pleasant weather steering W. by N. all sail out saw nothing this day
Lat. by Obs. 24° 12' N
Long by Chron. 179° 45' West

Wednesday, April 12th 1854

First part fine breeze from N.E. by E. and pleasant steering West. saw a fine bark Middle and latter part light variable winds from N.E. and pleasant steering W. by N. saw a school of Blackfish lowered the lar. boat with trawls the watch employ in ships duties
Crossed the Meridian

Friday, April 14th 1854

Saturday, April 15th 1854

First part light breeze from N.E. by E. and pleasant steering W. by N. all sail out saw a sail to E. Middle and latter parts fine breeze from N.E. by E. and pleasant steering W. by N. all sail out saw nothing the watch employ in breaking out between decks this ends this day
Lat. by Obs. 25° 59' N
Long by Chron. 176° 20' East

Sunday, April 16th 1854

First part fine breeze at N.E. and pleasant steering W. by N. saw nothing the watch employ in breaking out Middle and latter parts light breeze and easy steering W. by N. saw nothing lowered trawl for a pigeon and a herring

Friday, April 21st 1854

This day fresh breeze from N.E. and easy at 3 P.M. lashed ship to S.W. by W. at 7 P.M. took in the light sails Middle and latter parts strong wind from N.E. by E. and overcast weather steering S.W. by W. all the ship under D. R. topsails at 9 A.M. struck out the reef and let her move this ends this day

Saturday, April 22nd 1854

First part fresh breeze from N.E. and pleasant steering N.W. by W. all sail set Middle and latter parts strong breeze from N.E. by E. and easy foggy weather steering N.W. by W. the light sail in saw nothing
So ends this day
Lat. by Obs. 35° 12' N
Long by Chron. 165° 20' East

Sunday, April 23rd 1854

First part fresh breeze from South and some rain steering S.W. by W. the light sail in Middle and latter parts strong breeze from S.W. and pleasant steering S.W. by W. under whole topsails saw a ship to N.W. this ends this day
Lat. by Obs. 38° 12' N
