

Ship Wm Wirt in Port

Saturday Nov. 1st 1854

First part light airs from North and pleasant steering S.W. 2 sleeping sails set caught 2 Dolphins Middle and latter parts with a fine fresh breeze S.E. and pleasant weather steering S.W. all possible sail out saw a sail to W. westward so ends this day

Sunday Nov. 2nd 1854

First part fine breeze from E. N. E. and pleasant steering S.W. employ in ships duties saw nothing Middle and latter parts fine Trades from E. N. E. and pleasant steering S.W. all sail out so ends this day

Monday Nov. 3rd 1854

First part fine breeze from N. E. and pleasant weather steering S.W. saw nothing Dist. run the last 24 hours 148 miles the E. point of Maui bears S.W. by W. dist 18.3 miles Middle and latter parts strong Trades and pleasant weather steering S.W. at 10 A.M. raised East point of Maui to Sward saw 2 sails so ends this day

Tuesday Nov. 4th 1854

First part fine Trade wind and pleasant steering for the passage between Maui and Moloai at 10 A.M. came to an anchor in 26 fthms water so ends Sea Account

Tuesday Nov. 4th 1854

This day light airs and fine weather. Employed in getting up 3000 lbs for water. 69 sails in port no merchant ships in. Several ships arrived and as many more sailed so ends this day

Wednesday Nov. 5th 1854

This day light and pleasant at 4 A.M. hove up and run in shore and came to in 10 fthms. water sent a raft on shore for water so ends this day

Thursday Nov. 10th 1854

These 24 hours a breeze and pleasant weather got part of the raft off and stowed it down and sent it on shore again Discharged Mr. Lorange the 3rd mate and his boatsteward Wm Wood

Lahiana Maui Nov. 1854

Friday Nov. 11th 1854

This day light breezes and pleasant weather at 6 A.M. got under way and towed out 2 miles and came to in 22 fthms water transhiped our Bone on board the ship Marengo of N.B. to take home, there was 174 Bundles which weigh 23888 lbs. thus ends this day

Saturday Nov. 12th 1854

This day fine weather and light breeze took part of a raft on shore the Steamer Sea Bird arrive from O'hee and sailed for Hilo so ends the day

Sunday Nov. 13th 1854

These 24 hours strong wind from North and pleasant the Star watch on Liberty at 7 P.M. all on board except Roland Prophet who is tight

Monday Nov. 14th 1854

First part of these 24 hours a fine breeze from N. E. W. and overcast weather put 1 heavy load of Bbls. of Oil on board the ship Marengo found it too rough to work sent the Seaw on shore the ship Roman arrive

Tuesday Nov. 15th 1854

This day light airs and pleasant Ship Bbls. of oil on board the Marengo and took 4 casks of Coal from her and sent the Seaw on shore and towed off a raft of 25 casks of water the Katoia arrive and Steamer Sea Bird arrive and sailed for Hilo so ends the day

Wednesday Nov. 16th 1854

First part strong Wind from S. E. W. and rainy weather the Lar. watch on shore those on board employ in ships duties the Cook deserted

Thursday Nov. 17th 1854

This day light airs and fine weather the Star watch on shore found the Cook in the fort took him out and sent him aboard so ends the day

Friday Nov. 18th 1854

This day light breeze and pleasant weather the Lar. watch on shore those on board employ in painting ship so ends this day
