Thursday March 8th 1855

This day fresh trades from E. N. E. and pleasant steering W. by N. weather thus ends this day

Latt. by Obs. 19.35. S.
Long. by Chron. 73.2.50 W.

Friday Mar. 9th 1855

This day fresh breeze from E. by N. and pleasant weather steering W. by N. all sail out at 9 A.M. raised Owyhee steering W. by N. thus ends this day

Latt. by Obs. 20.17. N.
Long. by Chron. 73.4.58 W.

Saturday Mar. 10th 1855

First part of these 24 hours fresh trades from Eward and pleasant steering W. by N. by Owyhee at 4 P.M. raised Maui bent the cables 40 & 20 fathoms and latter part light air from Eastward steering for Maui at 10 A.M. calm so ends this day

Sunday March 11th 1855

First part a light air from Eward at 1 P.M. arose at Lahaina and came to anchor in 10 fathoms water 10 Whalers in port so ends sea ast.

Sunday March 12th 1855

This day light wind and pleasant part of the crew on shore at 7 P.M. all hands on board so ends this day

Monday Mar. 12th 1855

These 24 hours fresh wind and equally with rain got all ready for Sailing all hands on board so ends this day

Tuesday Mar. 13th

This day light breeze and rainy weather steering the Star watch on shore 2 men got in the fort for getting tight so ends this

Wednesday Mar. 14th 1855

This day light breeze and pleasant the Star watch on Liberty at 7 P.M. all hands on board so ends this day

Thursday March 15th 1855

This day strong breeze from Sward the Star watch on shore at 7 P.M. all on board so ends this day

Friday March 16th 1855

This day strong wind from Sward the Star watch on shore the Ship Ameron parted the chain and put to sea at 2 P.M. the Ship dragged let go the Star Anchor at 9 the wind falls took it again so ends this day

Saturday Mar. 17th 1855

This day pleasant weather broke out and sent on shore and sold 103 Bbls of whale oil so ends this day

Sunday Mar. 18th 1855

This day light air and pleasant part of the crew on shore the Ship Washington arose so ends this day

Monday Mar. 19th 1855

This day light air and pleasant broke out our sperm oil and sent it on shore to be stored for the season so ends this day

Tuesday Mar. 20th 1855

This day light breeze from Eward and pleasant the employ in Ships duties so ends this day John Evans came on board to go the season with us

Wednesday Mar. 21st

This day light air and pleasant took 26 Bbls of Potatoes from the Schooner Warwick so ends this day

Thursday March 22nd

This day fine weather a Boatsteward Olan Wilcome on Board to go the season with us so ends this day

Friday Mar. 23rd 1855

This day light breeze and pleasant took 45 Bbls of Potatoes of from the Warwick so ends this day

Saturday Mar. 24th 1855

This day light breeze and some rain Ship ready for sea waiting for men so ends this day

Saturday March 25th 1855

These 24 hours light air and rainy 2 Ships sailed the Minerva, Petrel, and Washington Capt. Holley so ends this
