Monday Mar. 26th 1853

This day light breeze and pleasant at 10 A.M. got under way and stood out 2 ships in company So Ends Civil & Co.

Tuesday Mar. 27th 1853

First part strong trades from E. wind at 4 P.M. the Capt. came on Board with Mr. Raymond our 4th mate. Squared away for Honolulu. Middle and latter part strong wind from East and pleasant weather. at 2 A.M. arrive off Honolulu the Capt. went on shore & ship's lay off and on with us So Ends this day

Wednesday Mar. 28th 1853

First part fresh breeze from E. wind and pleasant at 4 A.M. the Capt. came on Board and squared the yards for the Sea of Oahu. The Bark Louisa in company. Middle and latter part strong breeze and rainy steering West under S. R. top sails the Louisa in company So Ends this day

Thursday Mar. 29th 1853

This day fresh breeze from E. wind and pleasant steering West all sail the watch employ in ships duties gamed with the Louisa So Ends this day

Friday Mar. 29th 1853

These 24 hours fresh breeze from S. E. and pleasant steering West. the watch employ in ships duties gamed with the Bark So Ends this day

Saturday Mar. 30th 1853

First part of these 24 hours light winds and raining the watch employ in ships duties the Louisa in company, So Ends this day

Sunday Mar. 31st 1853

This day light airs and pleasant steering W. by S. gamed with the Louisa So Ends this day

Monday April 2nd 1853

First part light breeze from S. S. W. had a heavy squall. Middle and latter part fine breeze from S. S. W. the Louisa in sight

the S. Isles and the Ochoa Sea April 1853

Tuesday April 3rd 1853

These 24 hours fresh breeze from S. W. and some rain last sight of the Louisa the watch employ in ships duties So Ends this day

Long. by Chron. 164° 33' W.

Wednesday April 4th 1853

This day strong breeze from W. S. W. and pleasant steering by the wind to S. W. wind raised the Bark to wind and of us So Ends this day
Lat. by Obs. 20° 56' N.
Long. by Chron. 170° 14' W.

Thursday April 5th 1853

This day a light breeze from S. W. wind and pleasant steering W. by S. the Bark in company sent a gun fly fore topsail Main 3 yellow sail and bent another fore sail and brass top sail opened a Chest of Sea. 62 lb. So Ends this day
Lat. by Obs. 20° 56' N.
Long. by Chron. 172° 00' W.

Friday April 6th 1853

This day a light E. S. E. breeze and pleasant steering W. by S. the watch employ in mending sails gamed with the Bark So Ends this day
Lat. by Obs. 20° 50' N.
Long. by Chron. 173° 09' W.

Saturday April 7th 1853

This day strong breeze from S. E. and pleasant weather steering W. by S. the Bark in company the watch employ in ships duties saw nothing
Lat. by Obs. 17° 42' N.
Long. by Obs. 20° 53' S. S.

Sunday April 8th 1853

This day strong winds from S. E. and pleasant steering West. a ship passed us which was called the Harvest of Paris So Ends this day
at 3 P.M. crossed the Meridian
Lat. by Obs. 20° 35' N.
Long. by Chron. 173° 00' W.
Long. by Chron. 175° 58' W.

Monday April 9th West Long.

Tuesday April 10th East Long.

First part strong wind from S. S. E. steering W. by S. gamed with the Bark & latter part light breeze and pleasant So Ends this day
Lat. by Obs. 20° 34' N.
Long. by Chron. 176° 31' East
