

Ship Wm. Whit of New Bedford

Saturday Aug 4th A.D. 1851

All this day light breeze and some fog the ship at anchor 1 1/2 miles from the S.W. point Great Shantok Isle, got a raft of water from the shore fine showing down So Ends this day

Sunday Aug 5th

All these 24 hours light breeze and fine weather employ in stowing water &c. at 7 A.M. sent 2 Boats in shore to look for whale So Ends this day

Monday Aug 6th

This day light breeze and some fog sent 3 after whale those on board employ in scraping Bone at 10 A.M. got under way and stood in the Fishhook Har. and anchored So Ends this day

Tuesday Aug 7th

This day light baffling airs and some fog the 3 Boats still of after whale at the Horn Passage those on board employ in scraping Bone So Ends this day

Wednesday Aug 8th

Two first part fresh at Horn breeze and foggy the ship saw whale followed the other 2 Boats could not get on at 6 P.M. the other 2 Boats came on board they had seen plenty of whale all day latter part light breeze at 8 got under way at 10 A.M. came to again all hands employ in scraping Bone So Ends this day

Thursday Aug 9th

All this day light breeze and some fog and rain the ship at anchor the boats down fog whale those on board employ in ship's work So Ends this day

Friday Aug 10th

All this day overcast weather and calm with some rain and fog at 4 P.M. the Star. Bow. Boat struck a whale and turned him off. got alongside at 6 A.M. over board and cut him finished at noon sent 2 boats off So Ends this day

Whaling in the Ochotk Sea Aug 1851



Saturday Aug 11th A.D. 1851

All these 24 hours light airs and some fog the ship at anchor those on board employ in boiling at 5 A.M. the 2 Boats came on board towing a small whale they had picked up at 11 A.M. finished cutting So Ends this day

Sunday Aug 12th

All this day light breeze from E. and foggy the water employ in Boiling at 7 A.M. sent 2 Boats off after whale finished Boiling So Ends this day



Monday Aug 13th

All this day light breeze and some fog 2 Boats off got at 3 P.M. saw a dead whale from the ship got under way and took the whale alongside and came to again commenced cutting at dusk the other Boats came on board took the anchor and run in the Bay and came to again at 5 A.M. come over board and finished cutting sent 2 Boats off So Ends this day



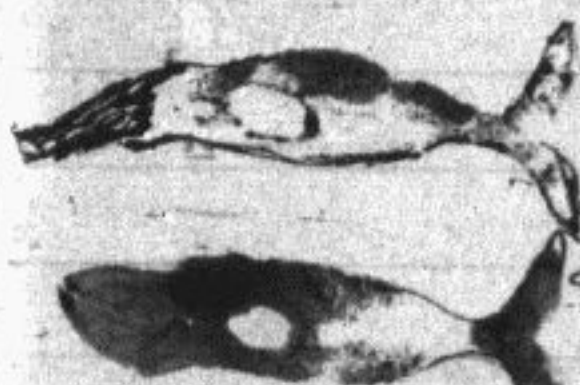
Tuesday Aug 14th

All this day light breeze and overcast rainy weather the boats of for whale those on board employ in Boiling the ship still at anchor So Ends this day with 4 Boats off



Wednesday Aug 15th

All these 24 hours light breeze and pleasant at noon the waist Boat struck and killed a whale at 5 P.M. the ship got to him took commenced cutting at 9 P.M. lashed down all the Boats on board at 1 P.M. finished cutting saw 2 dead Whales lowered and took them in tow saw plenty of whale So Ends this day



Thursday Aug 16th

These 24 hours light baffling wind and fine weather at 4 P.M. got the 2 whales to the ship and commenced cutting the day closed with all the boat aboard and the work ending latter part finished cutting So Ends this day

Friday Aug 17th

All this day light breeze and pleasant 2 Boats off those on board employ in boiling So Ends this day



Saturday Aug 18th

This day fine breeze from N.E. and pleasant the waist Boat struck and killed a whale under the Stern there got under way and at 1 P.M. anchored 1 mile from the whale and 2 from the land a strong current here at 1 P.M. sent the Boat to tow the whale at 10 A.M. got the whale to the ship
