

Ship Wm. Whit of New Bedford cruising in the



Tuesday Sept 4th A.D. 1833

This day fresh breeze from the west and pleasant laying off and on the land under topsails and jibs. Saw some whales going the watch employ in ships duties So Ends this day



Wednesday Sept 5th

This day strong breeze from the west and squally steering along the land to the S.E. ward saw 1 whale the watch employ in scraping bone and Coopering oil. Spoke the Benj. Rush off the Port of Agam. So Ends this day

Thursday Sept 6th

This day strong breeze from the West. The ship under D.R. top sail on the wind at 7 A.M. Reep off East under all sail the watch employ in scraping bone. Lat 56. 30. N Long. 146. 33. E. So Ends this day

Friday Sept 7th

All this day light breeze and pleasant steering East under all sail the watch employ in scraping bone at day light saw St. Jovaz Island bearing E. by S. Dist 40 miles at 12 miles hooked up a cask of oil. So Ends this day

Saturday Sept 8th

First part light dry air and pleasant steering N.E. by E. all sail under and latter part thick fog the watch employ in the washing bone. So Ends this day

Sunday Sept 9th

All this day light S. by E. breeze and thick overcast weather steering E. all sail out the watch employ in washing bone So Ends this day

Monday 10th of Sept.

First part light breeze from S.E. the ship on the E. on tack middle and latter part the wind blows to S.E. the ship heading E. by E. under D.R. top sail saw nothing So Ends this day

Tuesday Sept 11

This day fresh breeze from the E. wind the ship on the E. on tack employ in ships duties saw 1 whale So Ends this day

Sea of Okhotsk E. R. Ashby Master Sept 1833

Wednesday Sept 12th A.D. 1833

First part light winds from S.E. and overcast weather. Spoke the Bark Robt. Morrison cutting her 5th whale right whale picked up middle and latter parts. Strong gale and overcast from N.E. Ship under D.R. top sails a close reefed main topsail 2 ships in sight So Ends this day

Thursday Sept 13th

First part strong wind from N.E. Ship double reefed topsails middle and latter parts light breeze and pleasant made all sail the watch employ in ships duties So Ends this day



Friday Sept 14th

First part strong N.E. winds and clear weather ship on the E. on tack middle and latter part light breeze and pleasant at 11 A.M. raised a right whale lowered 2 boats without success the watch employ in drying bone So Ends this day



Saturday Sept 15th

This day fresh breeze from the W. and fine weather saw some right whales lowered did not strike So Ends this day



Sunday Sept 16th

This day light dry breeze and pleasant the ship on both tacks saw some right whale did not strike So Ends this day

Monday Sept 17th

All this day light winds and thick weather the ship on both tacks the watch employ in ships duties saw nothing Thus Ends this day



Tuesday Sept 18th

All this day fresh breeze from the West with pleasant weather the ship going S.E. all sail out at 6 P.M. took in sail and set the watches for the night at daylight made all sail saw 1 right whale going quick So Ends this day



Wednesday Sept 19th

First part strong W. wind the ship on both tacks saw 3 whales could not get hold middle and latter part strong gale from the westward and pleasant weather laying to under a close reefed main top sail saw 4 ships So Ends this day
