Monday Mar 17th A.D. 1856

All this day strong wind from North & overcast weather steering E. by N. under S. R. topsails & courses so Ends this day No Ob.

Tuesday Mar 18th

First part strong breeze from N. with overcast weather steering E. by N. under S. R. topsails & foresails at 7 P.M. had a heavy squall the wind S. S. W. dead before it & got the ship under a close reefed main topsail & staysails hauled off E. N. E. before the sea turned we pitched into it & cut fore rigging middle & latter more moderate made sail steers E. N. E. so Ends this day Lat. by Obs. 36.25 S. Long by Chron 37.13 W.

Wednesday Mar 19th

All this day light breeze from S. S. W. & pleasant steering E. N. E. at 7 A.M. all hands employ in bundling Bone saw nothing so Ends this day Lat. by Obs. 33.34 S. Long by Chron 35.13 W.

Thursday Mar 20th

First part light breeze from S. & pleasant steering E. N. E. bundled since morning & 1 bundle of Bone middle & latter parts strong wind from S. S. E. steering E. N. E. the light sail in saw nothing the watch employ in ships duties so Ends this day Lat. by Obs. 33.48 S. Long by Chron 32.38 W.

Friday Mar 21st

All this day fresh breeze from the S. & pleasant weather steering N. E. all sail out saw nothing the watch employ in ships duties so Ends this day Lat. by Obs. 31.10 S. Long by Chron 31.14 W.

N. South Atlantic Ocean Bound Home 1856

Saturday Mar 22nd A.D. 1856

All this day light breeze from N. E. & overcast some rainy weather the ship on both tacks by the wind saw nothing the watch employ in ships duties so Ends this day Lat. by Obs. 29.44 S. Long by Chron 31.24 W.

Sunday Mar 23rd

All this day variable winds & squalls from N. E. ward some rain the ship by the wind on both tacks twice under a S. R. topsail & foresail in the squalls which are hard so Ends this day So No Ob.

Monday Mar 24th

All this day fine breeze from N. by E. & pleasant weather steering by the wind on both tacks saw nothing so Ends this day day Lat. by Obs. 28.40 S. Long by Chron 30.13 W.

Tuesday Mar 25th

First & middle parts fresh breeze from North & pleasant weather steering by the wind to E. by N. all sail out at 3 P.M. saw a Brig ahead at 12 passed her latter part calm & gamed with Brig Arnon of Scarborough Yorkshire 9 weeks from Vane Diemenas land for London so Ends this day No Ob.

Wednesday Mar 26th

This day calm & pleasant weather the watch employ in ships duties the Brig to S. W. 3 miles off so Ends this day Lat. by Obs. 28.48 S. Long by Chron 30.28 W.
