 to the S.E. latter part light S.W. & squally
 steering by the wind to the Westward
 Lat by Ob 3.01 N

 300 several breaches but no spout the perfect
 looks weather dark now but by & old saying
 that the darkest time is just before day
 I am in hope that it will turn out so

 steering by the wind to the Westward
 Lat by Ob 2.49 N
 Long by Lunar 88.57 W

Thursday June 30th
 Come in with fine weather steering by the
 wind to the Westward at 5 P.M. saw
 Shearm Whaler Lard the Beach Sept.
 to no purpose at 6 came on board a sail
 in sight to leeward middle & latter
 part moderate breeze & fine weather at
 midnight packed ship to the Westward
 one sail in sight by Stern
 Lat by Ob 3.07 N

Friday July 1st
 began with fine weather wind South
 steering to the Westward middle & latter
 part much the same one sail in sight
 Lat by Ob 3.20

Saturday July 2nd
 Come in with fine weather steering by
 the wind to the Westward at 2 P.M. spoke
 the ship Bon of Warren R.I. 26 months out
 with 100 Bbls & at 4 spoke the ship
 Ann Elizabeth of New Bedford & Mon. through
 & Boiling her first whaler latter part fresh
 breeze & cloudy steering by the wind to the East
 Lat by Ob

Sunday July 3rd
 Come in with strong trade & cloudy weather
 steering by the wind to the Eastward latter
 part light breeze with passing clouds at
 6 P.M. packed ship to the Westward, sail in
 sight
 Lat by Ob 3.02 North
