

Ship Wilmington & Liverpool Packet

Friday November 25th
begins with fresh breeze from the N.E.
Springing up at 4 P.M. in
the Latitude of 6.50 North and Longitude
of 154.10 E. Made the Island of Spencer
bearing off per compass 7 leagues
Dist at 5 P.M. hauled up the Chains
and sent them at Hurdson Shortens
Sail and hauled on the night off shore
at daylight kept off at 10 P.M.
The Pilot came on board and we kept
off for the Bay harbor.

Lat by Obs. 6.46.05

Saturday November 26th
Comes in with fine weather at 2 P.M. Came
to Anchor in 8 fathoms of Water. Gathered
great fire at 7 P.M. sent the Watch
on shore on Land by Employed Watering
Staying the Main to the North E.

Sunday November 27th
Throughout there 24 hours, Moderate breeze
with squalls of rain at 4 P.M. the Schooner
Thomson Crisp of London came in from the
Weather Warbour.

Monday November 28th
All of these 24 hours variable weather
Employed Working Watering &c

Tuesday November 29th
Throughout this 24 hours pleasant breeze
with fine weather at 4 P.M. went
with 2 boats and towed the Schooner
out side of the Rock so now we are
left alone in this miserable bay
which I hate my feet quite Lame
and I don't care how soon we are off
out of this Verape.

Wind Bound, 1842

Monday December 1st
Throughout this 24 hours fresh Gale and
squally. The ship riding with both Anchors
down and we looking anxiously for
a change of weather.

Tuesday December 2nd
Throughout this 24 hours variable weather
at 2 P.M. hove up the second Anchor
at 10 P.M. A Swedish Brig came in
from Sidney.

Wednesday December 3rd
Throughout this 24 hours rainy weather wind
from all points of the compass.

Thursday December 4th
All of these 24 hours calm and pleasant
weather. I have strong hopes of having a
fair wind tomorrow.

Friday December 5th
Throughout this 24 hours fine pleasant weather
at 4 P.M. got underway and hauled the
ship outside of the Rock but the sea breeze
coming in we was forced to put back and
come to Anchor again at 11 P.M. I went
on shore for 10 Casks of Water.

Saturday December 6th
Comes in with calm and pleasant weather
at 4 P.M. got of the draft and started the
sails. Sailed with pleasant breeze from the
N.E. Latter part calm at 4 P.M. hove
up the Anchor and made sail but the
wind died away and left us as usual. Then
ends another week as we are no nearer
out than we was last week but I have
strong hopes of a fair wind tomorrow morning.
