Comes in with pleasant weather wind from the East. Steering West by compass. Took in sail for the night. After part cloudy and foggy. Wind backing to the northward. Raining.

No Observation

Wednesday 29th

Commences with cloudy, rainy, and foggy weather, wind variable. Frequent squalls accompanied with rain. Lying to under close reefed main topsail. Wore ship at 2 and 5 o'clock. Ship heading at sundown N.W. by W. on Starboard tack. I feel well thank God. After part heavy gales from N.E. Wore ship at 7 A.M. Rainy-foggy &c.

No Observation this day

Thursday 30th

Commences with Heavy gales from S.W. & Rainy and foggy. Lying to under close reefed main topsail. After part moderate, but a heavy sea on. Squally accompanied with rain. Wore ship at 6 A.M. ship heading N.W. on Starboard tack.

Friday 31st

Commences with gales from the northward & Eastward. Rainy & thick weather. I am troubled with that disease called the Blues. Another month and no whale. Oh Cranberries. Patience, Patience, middle and After part moderate, smooth, and pleasant. Wind from N.E. by E. Steering by the wind in search of sperm Whales. saw 10 hump backs.

Saturday April 1st 1843

Commences with pleasant gales from S.W. & wind hauling gradually to the Southward and Eastward. Steering by the wind. Shortened sail at sundown for the night. After part heavy gales from the Westward. Lying to close reefed main topsail and foresail and mizen. Felt the ship tremble supposed an earthquake. Lat 29.22 N.

Long 139.30 E.

Sunday 2nd

Commences with gales from S.W. by W. Lying to. Wore ship at 2 P.M. After part much the same. Wore ship at 7 A.M. Ship heading S. S. E.

Monday 3rd

Commences with gales from the northward and westward. Wore ship at 1 1/2 P.M. Ship heading West South West. Lying to under close reefed main topsail. Foresail fore topmast stay-sail and mizen. After part moderate and pleasant. Wore ship at 6 A.M. Watch employed breaking out and cooping oil. ship heading at 12 m N.E. on larboard tack.

Lat by Obs 28.45 North

Tuesday 4th

Commences with light breezes from the N.W. Watch employed cooping oil. Lying to. Middle part light winds after part calm and pleasant.

Lat 28.41 North

Wednesday 5th

Commences with calm and pleasant weather all hands employed cooping oil. Wore ship at 3 P.M. After part moderate breezes from S.E.
